<u>Scope of Project</u>: The Mississippi Department of Education, through the Office of Curriculum and Instruction, conducted an adoption of textbooks in the areas of Reading K-3, Literature/ Reading 4-8, Literature/Reading 9-12 and Social Studies: World Geography and Citizenship — 6th Grade.

In accordance with Section 37-43-25 of the Mississippi Code of 1972 Annotated and the 2008 Textbook Adoption Handbook Rules and Regulations, the bidder to whom contracts are awarded will be required to provide the following:

- Three copies of the Official Mississippi Textbook Contract without change, addition or modification.
- A good and sufficient bond executed in triplicate, and payable to the State
 of Mississippi with a surety thereon. The amount of said bond as fixed by
 the State Board of Education is \$2,500 plus \$500 per title or grade level.
 Publishers must execute the sufficient bond by the date specified.
- A stock of textbooks sufficient to meet all reasonable and immediate demands to be held at the School Book Supply Company of Mississippi.

Personnel associated with this contract are not former Department employees or related to any Department employees.

Summary of Selection Process:

A call for bids process was utilized.

Scoring Criteria:

Textbooks/materials were reviewed in the following instructional categories:

- Reading K-3
- Literature/Reading 4-8
- Literature/Reading 9-12
- Social Studies: World Geography and Citizenship 6th Grade

The state rating committee may recommend as many as eight titles in each instructional category. An item is not rated if it does not meet the following criteria:

- 1. The title must meet the definition of a textbook as defined in Section 37-43-1 of the *Mississippi Code of 1972, Annotated.* A textbook shall be defined as any medium or manual of instruction which contains a systematic presentation of the principals of a subject and which constitutes a major instructional vehicle for that subject.
- 2. Courses containing sex education other than biological science courses are to include abstinence education.
- 3. The materials in the textbook must provide comprehensive coverage of the course content as outlined in the Mississippi Language Arts Framework 2006, the 2011 Social Studies: World Geography and Citizenship 6th grade Curriculum Framework, the College Board Advanced Placement Framework, the Common Core State Standards for English Language Arts and Literacy in History/Social Studies, Science, and Technical Subjects, and meet at least 80 percent of the mandated standards/competencies.

MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972

As Amended

SEC. 37-43-25. Retention of specimen copies of textbooks, contracts and bonds, and copies of bids.

Specimen copies of all textbooks, which have been made the basis of contracts under the provisions of this chapter, clearly marked and identified as such, shall be deposited by the publisher of said books with the State Superintendent of Public Education. Said specimen copies shall be preserved and kept open for inspection by the public.

All contracts and bonds executed under the provisions of this chapter shall be executed in triplicate, one (1) copy for the contractor, one (1) copy to be filed in the Office of the Secretary of State, and one (1) copy to be filed in the office of the State Superintendent of Public Education.

An original of each bid, whether accepted or rejected, shall be filed and preserved in the office of the State Superintendent of Public Education for at least five (5) years.

MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972

As Amended

SEC. 37-43-1. Purpose of chapter; distribution of textbooks to schools and pupils; definition of "board" and "textbook".

This chapter is intended to furnish a plan for the adoption, purchase, distribution, care and use of free textbooks to be loaned to the pupils in all elementary and high schools of Mississippi.

The books herein provided by the State Board of Education, which shall be the State Textbook Procurement Commission, shall be distributed and loaned free of cost to the children of the free public schools of the state and of all other schools located in the state, which maintain educational standards equivalent to the standards established by the State Department of Education for the state schools as outlined in the Approval Requirements of the State Board of Education for Nonpublic Schools.

Teachers shall permit all pupils in all grades of any public school to carry to their homes for home study, the free textbooks loaned to them, and any other regular textbooks whether they be free textbooks or not.

For the purposes of this chapter, the term "board" shall mean the State Board of Education.

Textbook shall be defined as any medium or manual of instruction which contains a systematic presentation of the principles of a subject and which constitutes a major instructional vehicle for that subject.
