DIVISION OF EDUCATOR LICENSURE

F. <u>Approval to begin the Administrative Procedures Act process: To revise</u> <u>Career Pathway licensure options, 985 Engineering; 912 Law and Public</u> <u>Safety; 975 Welding; and to establish one new Career Pathway in the</u> <u>endorsement area of Instrumentation</u>

<u>Background Information</u>: During its regularly scheduled meeting on September 14, 2018, the Commission on Teacher and Administrator Education, Certification, and Licensure and Development granted approval to a request received from the Office of Secondary Education to revise two Career and Technical Education (CTE) Career Pathway educator licensure endorsement areas to become effective Academic Year 2018 – 2019, one CTE Career Pathway educator licensure endorsement area to become effective Academic Year 2019 – 2020, and to establish one new CTE Career Pathway and endorsement code to become effective Academic Year 2019 – 2020. The proposed criteria for obtaining licensure in one of the following Career Pathway endorsement areas are outlined as follows:

Endorsement 985 Career Pathway: Engineering

The Office of Secondary Education is requesting approval to add additional degree areas and endorsements to the Educational requirement. Currently, there are two degrees used to determine an educator's eligibility to obtain the endorsement. The proposal is to add seven (7) additional eligible degrees and eleven (11) acceptable endorsement areas.

Endorsement 912 Career Pathway: Law and Public Safety

The Office of Secondary Education is requesting approval to revise the occupational competency requirements. Currently, a prospective educator is required to complete five emergency management certifications. The course names and content have been updated, and one course has been discontinued.

Endorsement 975 Career Pathway: Welding

The Office of Secondary Education is requesting approval to add an additional occupational competency requirement. Currently, prospective educators seeking to obtain an endorsement in the area of Welding are required to take a performance or written assessment. Effective 2019 – 2020 Academic Year, candidates would be required to complete both components.

Endorsement (TBD) Career Pathway: Instrumentation

The Office of Secondary Education is requesting approval to establish one new Career Pathway to become available Academic Year 2019 – 2020. The curriculum and courses for this program of study are under development. Proposed licensure requirements have been aligned in accordance with standard CTE program of study criteria.

985 Career Pathway: Engineering

This endorsement licenses a person to teach the following courses:

- 994001 Engineering II
- 994002 Engineering Fundamentals
- 994003 Engineering Design

Minimum Requirements for this Endorsement:

1. Education

Applicant must have earned a four-year college degree (bachelor degree) or higher from an accredited institution of higher education. Degree must be in engineering, mathematics, <u>physics</u>, <u>chemistry</u>, <u>computer science</u>, <u>electrical technology</u>, <u>electronics technology</u>, <u>industrial technology</u>, <u>engineering technology</u> or an appropriate field of science (approved by MDE program coordinator) <u>or currently have one of the following endorsements: 154 - Math, 185 or 627 – Chemistry, 189 or 629 or 630 or 631 – Physics, 609 or 610 – Calculus, 612 or 613 – Computer <u>Science</u>.
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2. Technology Literacy and Related Assessment

- Applicant must validate technology competency by attaining the established minimum score or higher on an assessment approved by the Mississippi Department of Education (MDE). The assessment must be directly related to technology competency required by the grade level and subject matter being taught. Approved assessment for this license is IC3.

3. Occupational Experience and Related Assessment of that Experience

- Verification of at least one year of full-time occupational experience in the past ten years. This experience must be appropriate to the subject area to be taught.
- All successful applicants must hold bachelor or higher degree in the subject area to be taught. This degree in subject area exempts applicant from any additional occupational competency testing.

4. Teacher Education Preparation and Related Assessment(s) of that Education

- Applicant must enroll immediately in Vocational Instructor Preparation (VIP) program (Exception: those teachers that have a currently valid five year license or have completed an alternate route program don't have to enroll in VIP).
- Applicant must complete the individualized professional development plan (PDP) requirements of the VIP program prior to the expiration date of the three-year Career & Technical license.
- Applicant must successfully complete a Certification for online learning workshop, module, or course that is approved by the Mississippi Department of Education
- Applicant must successfully complete the Engineering Certification workshop, module, or course that is approved by the Mississippi Department of Education.

Note: If the applicant meets all requirements listed above, that applicant will be issued a 985 endorsement—a five-year license. If the applicant meets the educational and occupational experience requirements, but does not meet all other requirements, the applicant may be issued one (1) three-year endorsement (license), and all requirements stated above must be satisfied prior to the ending date of that license.

912 Career Pathway: Law and Public Safety

This endorsement licenses a person to teach the following secondary courses:

Minimum Requirements for this Endorsement:

1. Education

Applicant must have earned a two-year college degree (associate degree) or higher from an accredited institution of higher education. The degree must be in Criminal Justice, Emergency Medicine (EMC), Political Science, Social Science, or an appropriate, related field approved by the MDE program coordinator.

2. Technology Literacy and Related Assessment of that Competency

- Applicant must validate technology competency by attaining the established minimum score or higher on an assessment approved by the Mississippi Department of Education (MDE). The assessment must be directly related to technology competency required by the grade level and subject matter being taught. Approved assessments for this license are IC3 or other approved MDE substitute.

3. Occupational Experience and Related Assessment of that Experience

- Applicants with an associate degree must have at least three years of verifiable occupational experience in the past ten years. Experience must be appropriate to the subject to be taught.
- Applicants with a bachelor or higher degree must have at least one year of verifiable occupational experience in the past ten years. Experience must be appropriate to the subject to be taught. This endorsement requires the following assessment(s) of occupational expertise:
- Applicant must possess and maintain a Community Emergency Response Teams (CERT) Trainer Certification.
- Applicant must possess and maintain National Incident Management System certifications:
 - . 100.b Introduction to Incident Command System
 - . 100.LEb -- Introduction to the Incident Command System of Law Enforcement
 - . 200.bICS ICS for Single Resources and Initial Action Incidents

 Applicant must enroll immediately in Vocational Instructor Preparation (VIP) program.
 (Exception: Those teachers that have a currently valid five-year license or have completed an alternate route program do not have to enroll in VIP).
 - Applicant must complete the individualized professional development plan (PDP) requirements of the VIP program prior to the expiration date of the three-year Career & Technical license.
 - Applicant must successfully complete a Certification for online learning workshop, module, or course that is approved by the Mississippi Department of Education,
 - Applicant must successfully complete the Law and Public Safety Certification workshop, module, or course that is approved by the Mississippi Department of Education.

Note: If the applicant meets all requirements listed above, that applicant will be issued a 912 endorsement—

a five-year license. Minimum Requirements for this Endorsement:

1. Education

Applicant must have earned a two-year college degree (associate degree) or higher from an accredited institution of higher education.

2. Technology Literacy and Related Assessment of that Competency

Applicant must validate technology competency by attaining the established minimum score or higher on an assessment approved by the Mississippi Department of Education (MDE). The assessment must be directly related to technology competency required by the grade level and subject matter being taught. Approved assessments for this license are IC3 or other approved MDE substitute.

3. Occupational Experience and Related Assessment of that Experience

- Applicants with an associate degree must have at least two years of verifiable occupational experience in the past ten years. Experience must be appropriate to the subject to be taught.
- Applicants with a bachelor or higher degree must have at least one year of verifiable occupational experience in the past ten years. Experience must be appropriate to the subject to be taught.
- Applicant must earn a passing score on a Welding (performance & written)* Assessment: TOCA at RCU—Welding or hold American Welding Society (AWS) Certification or NCCER welding assessment. The performance assessment should include successful completion of seven test plates out of the fourteen test plates listed in the curriculum (please see curriculum for list). Or
- <u>Other teacher occupational competency assessment approved by MDE Office of Career and</u> <u>Technical Education</u>

4. Teacher Education Preparation and Related Assessment(s) of that Education

- Applicant must enroll immediately in Vocational Instructor Preparation (VIP) program. (Exception: Those teachers that have a currently valid five-year license or have completed an alternate route program do not have to enroll in VIP.)
- Applicant must complete the individualized professional development plan (PDP) requirements of the VIP program prior to the expiration date of the three-year Career & Technical license.
- Applicant must successfully complete the Contren NCCER Instructor Certification.
- Applicant must successfully complete a Certification for online learning workshop, module, or course that is approved by the Mississippi Department of Education.
- Applicant must successfully complete the Welding Certification workshop, module, or course that is approved by the Mississippi Department of Education.

Note: If the applicant meets all requirements listed above, that applicant will be issued a 975

endorsement—a five-year license. If the applicant meets the educational and occupational experience requirements, but does not meet all other requirements, the applicant may be issued one (1) three-year endorsement (license), and all requirements stated above must be satisfied prior to the ending date of that license.

2. Technology Literacy and Related Assessment of that Competency

Applicant must validate technology competency by attaining the established minimum score or higher on an assessment approved by the Mississippi Department of Education (MDE). The assessment must be directly related to technology competency required by the grade level and subject matter being taught. Approved assessments for this license are IC3 or other approved MDE_substitute.

3. Occupational Experience and Related Assessment of that Experience

- Applicants with an associate degree must have at least two years of verifiable occupational experience in the past ten years. Experience must be appropriate to the subject to be taught.
- <u>Applicants with a bachelor or higher degree must have at least one year of verifiable</u> occupational experience in the past ten years. Experience must be appropriate to the subject to be taught.
- <u>Applicant must earn a passing score on the NCCER Instrumentation written and performance assessments</u>

<u>Or</u>

- Other teacher occupational competency assessment approved by MDE Office of Career and Technical Education

4. Teacher Education Preparation and Related Assessment(s) of that Education

- <u>Applicant must enroll immediately in Vocational Instructor Preparation (VIP) program.</u>
 <u>(Exception: Those teachers that have a currently valid five-year license or have completed an alternate route program do not have to enroll in VIP.)</u>
- Applicant must complete the individualized professional development plan (PDP) requirements of the VIP program prior to the expiration date of the three-year Career & Technical license.
- Applicant must successfully complete a Certification for online learning workshop, module, or course that is approved by the Mississippi Department of Education.
- <u>Applicant must successfully complete the Instrumentation Certification workshop, module, or</u> <u>course that is approved by the Mississippi Department of Education.</u>

If the applicant meets the educational and occupational experience requirements, but does not meet all other requirements, the applicant may be issued one (1) three-year endorsement (license), and all requirements stated above must be satisfied prior to the ending date of that license.
