D. Approval to revise Miss. Admin. Code 7 – 4: Part 4: Licensure Guidelines K-12 to amend the Mississippi Alternate Path to Quality School Leadership Business Track and remove all references to the Mississippi Alternate Path to Quality Teachers (MAPQT) and Mississippi Alternate Path to Quality School Leadership (MAPQSL) Education Track nontraditional licensure pathways from the Licensure Guidelines as appropriate

(Has cleared the Administrative Procedures Act process with public comment)

Background Information: As confirmed through official correspondence submitted to the Office of Teaching and Leading (OTL) by the Executive Director of the Mississippi Community College Foundation (MCCF), dated October 1, 2019, the MCCF Board of Directors voted to suspend the administration of the Mississippi Alternate Path to Quality Teachers (MAPQT) and Mississippi Alternate Path to Quality School Leadership (MAPQSL) Education Track, State Board approved nontraditional licensure pathways. The respective 2019-2020 cohorts of prospective teachers and administrators served as the final cohorts to obtain a Mississippi educator license via these pathways. The MCCF has provided definitive timelines and guidance regarding the process for candidate program completion.

On November 6, 2020, the Commission on Teacher and Administrator Education, Certification, and Licensure and Development (Licensure Commission) granted approval to begin the Administrative Procedures Act (APA) process to amend the Mississippi Alternate Path to Quality School Leadership Business Track as this Administrator nontraditional Administrator Licensure Pathway as required by State law, particularly, Miss. Code Ann. §37-3-2(7)(d). The law requires that individuals seeking school administrator licensure under paragraph (b), (c) or (d) shall successfully complete a training program and an assessment process prescribed by the State Board of Education. The MAPQSL summer training program previously administered by the Mississippi Community College Foundation served as the training program approved by the State Board of Education as one criterion for individuals seeking to obtain administrator licensure via this Administrator License Nontraditional Route. To remain in accordance with State law, it is the recommnedation of the Ad Hoc Committee of the Licensure Commission to require completion of one hundred and twenty (120) hours of training as one criterion for obtaining an initial administrator licensure via the Administrator License -

Nontraditional Route. Acceptable training shall be offered by professional learning providers approved by the Mississippi Department of Education. The content of the training provided shall be aligned to the responsibilities of a Mississippi local school district administrator. Mississippi Department of Education approved professional growth opportunities may be offered by organizations such as, but is not limited to, the Mississippi School Board Association (MSBA), Mississippi Association of School Superintendents (MASS), Mississippi Association of School Administrators (MASA), Mississippi Association of School Business Officers (MASBO), or any other professional growth opportunities and providers approved by the Mississippi Department of Education.

In addition, approval was granted to remove from the Licensure Guidelines, any reference to the Mississippi Alternate Path to Quality Teachers (MAPQT) and Mississippi Alternate Path to Quality School Leadership (MAPQSL) Education Track, nontraditional licensure pathways, effective upon receipt of final State Board approval and in accordance with the Administrative Procedures Act process guidelines. The Division of Educator Licensure is requesting approval as recommended by the Licensure Commission.

The public comment period was open through 5:00 p.m. on January 12, 2021, with one (1) public comment received regarding the proposed revisions to Miss. Admin. Code 7-4: Part 4: *Licensure Guidelines K-12*.

The Division of Educator Licensure received the following APA comment regarding the proposed revisions to Miss. Admin. Summary of Comment

The requirements of these degrees will target a very small population.
