When it was identified through this research that hands only CPR could be as effective as breaths for adults, the AHA made it a priority to build awareness around these new standards. About 90 percent of people who suffer out-of-hospital cardiac arrests die. CPR, especially if performed immediately, can double or even triple a person's chance of survival. Sadly, most of the time it doesn't happen that way. In 2012, Mississippi passed legislation to make Hands Only CPR prior to high school graduation a requirement.

school in Mississippi will receive a *CPR in Schools* kit to help your school meet this graduation requirement. We are hosting "train the trainer" sessions in April at multiple locations across the state that will be led by certified CPR educators from the Mississippi Fire Academy.
