Minutes of Mississippi Board of Education Meeting

April 18, 2024

The members of the Mississippi Board of Education met at 10:00 a.m. on Thursday, April 18, 2024, pursuant to Miss. Code Ann. § 25-41-5 for the purpose of conducting a regularly scheduled Board meeting.

The public accessed this meeting via livestream or in-person at the Central High School Building, 4th Floor Boardroom, 359 North West Street, Jackson, Mississippi. Board members physically present included: Mr. Glen V. East, Dr. Wendi Barrett, Mr. Bill Jacobs, Mr. Matt Mayo, Dr. Ronnie L. McGehee, Mr. Matt Miller, Mr. Mike Pruitt, and Ms. Mary Werner. Student Representatives present: Mr. Charlie Frugé and Ms. Kate Riddle. Dr. Raymond C. Morgigno, Interim State Superintendent, was also present.

- I. Mr. Glen V. East called the Board meeting to order at 10:00 a.m., after determining that a quorum of the Board existed for the purpose of conducting a meeting.
- II. Ms. Mary Werner led the Pledge of Allegiance and Mr. Matt Miller gave the Invocation.
- III. On a motion by Ms. Mary Werner, seconded by Mr. Mike Pruitt, the Board unanimously approved the minutes of March 7, 2024 Board meeting.
- IV. On a motion by Mr. Matt Miller, seconded by Dr. Wendi Barrett, the Board unanimously adopted the Consent agenda as presented.

On a motion by Dr. Ronnie L. McGehee, seconded by Mr. Bill Jacobs, the Board approved the agenda as presented.

VI. Report of State Superintendent of Education

- Dr. Morgigno congratulated Mr. Charlie Frugé for being named one of Mississippi's seven U.S. Presidential Scholar semifinalists. Dr. Morgigno stated the finalists will be announced in May.
- Dr. Morgigno welcomed new Board members Mr. Matt Mayo and Ms. Billye Jean Stroud with Senate confirmations expected soon.
- Dr. Morgigno stated Senate confirmations were confirmed for Dr. Lance Evans, Mr. Glen East, and Mr. Mike Pruitt. Dr. Morgigno stated Dr. Evans will come on board July 1, 2024.
- Dr. Morgigno stated the Legislative session is still going on and Ms. Holly Spivey is doing a tremendous job in frequent meetings at the Capitol and with MDE staff.
- Dr. Morgigno stated MDE talked with the U.S. Department of Education and MDE will be one of three states hosting a regional convening on teaching profession and this will be held June 20-21, 2024 in Jackson. Dr. Morgigno stated that Dr. Courtney Van Cleve, Dr. Cory Murphy, Dr. Debra Burson, and their team will lead this meeting for MDE.
- Dr. Morgigno stated MDE had their financial audit by the Auditor's Office and for the first time in five years MDE had absolutely zero findings, so we really appreciate the work of our Finance Department.
- Dr. Morgigno stated he visited Holmes County Consolidated School District several weeks ago. Dr. Morgigno stated they recently had their audit and they had only two minor findings. Dr. Morgigno stated they have been a "C" for two years.
- Dr. Morgigno stated the final Student Advisory Council meeting of the year was held yesterday with Mr. Charlie Frugé and Ms. Kate Riddle facilitating the meeting. Dr. Morgigno stated the students had a research project that was assigned at the first meeting and the students presented their problems and the solutions. Dr. Morgigno stated the students produced some good ideas and they took time to do surveys and interviews. Dr. Morgigno stated they did a fantastic job, and he will share some of their information with teachers at an upcoming meeting.
- Dr. Morgigno stated the Superintendents Advisory Council was held recently and in the next few weeks MDE will hold the Regional Superintendents meetings around the state to give updates.
- Dr. Morgigno stated he had the privilege to attend the U.S. Military Academy at West Point Annual Educator Workshop. Dr. Morgigno stated it was a great opportunity to hear about their admission projects so it can be shared with our districts to make sure our students in Mississippi know the opportunities with the different service academies.
- Dr. Morgigno stated he and MDE staff attended the Council of Chief State School Officers (CCSSO) Legislative Conference, and we were able to meet with our congressional delegation. Dr. Morgigno stated they met with Representative Michael Guest, Representative Trent Kelly, and a member

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of Senator Roger Wicker's staff. Dr. Morgigno stated it was great to hear things on the national side.

- Dr. Morgigno stated he visited with the MASS President and some superintendents during this legislative session.
- Dr. Morgigno stated he participated on a panel at the Mississippi State
 University Symposium recently on Improving Opportunities and Quality of
 Life for People with Disabilities through Collaboration, Research, and
 Outreach.
- Dr. Morgigno stated he spoke at the Mississippi Professional Educators (MPE) Best Practices Symposium to about 300 teachers on a Saturday.
- Dr. Morgigno stated he spoke at the Annual Head Start Transition meeting in Holly Springs, hosted by the Institute of Community Services (ICS), Inc. Project Head Start. Dr. Morgigno stated the increased collaboration between our Head Starts and the school districts is phenomenal.
- Dr. Morgigno stated he visited Nichols Middle School in Canton last week. Dr. Morgigno stated he and Mr. Brian McGairty visited the Hayes Cooper Elementary School in Cleveland last week where they had an explosion and thankfully no students were injured. Dr. Morgigno stated that Delta State University has opened their campus for Hayes Cooper to have school. Dr. Morgigno stated it was great to see how everyone pulled together.
- VII. Mr. Glen V. East, Chair of the State Board, gave the following report:
 - Mr. East stated that Mr Charlie Frugé will be graduating and heading to Harvard. Mr. East read a Resolution for Mr. Charlie Frugé (copy attached).

VIII. Reports from Student Representatives

Ms. Kate Riddle thanked Mr. Charlie Frugé for mentoring her when she came to the Board. Ms. Riddle stated that Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) is important in Mississippi. Ms. Riddle stated that science and math are in every corner of our lives, and the way that they work, and function is fascinating. Ms. Riddle stated that every subject in STEM is important to ensuring that every student in Mississippi is well-rounded. STEM is vital to the success of every student in Mississippi, and its presence in the classroom should be prioritized and encouraged.

Mr. Charlie Frugé stated this is his final presentation before the Board. Mr. Frugé thanked the Board for having and keeping the student position because he feels the student perspective is a valuable thing on the Board. He stated that many states do not have student representatives. Mr. Frugé thanked all MDE staff who have helped him during his two years on the Board. Mr. Frugé stated that now he understands the depth and breadth of education and that MDE staff care about our state's progress. He stated that collaboration is key in education. Mr.

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Frugé stated that with the leadership at MDE our kids will grow, and he cannot wait to return home and see the progress.

IX. Reports on State Board of Education Subcommittee meetings

Dr. Wendi Barrett, Chair, Academic Achievement PreK-12/Early Childhood Subcommittee, met yesterday via Teams. Dr. Barrett stated that they discussed some additional PreK classrooms that are going to be added through the SIP Cohorts, revisions and changes to the Kindergarten Guidelines, and a new JROTC diploma endorsement option.

Mr. Bill Jacobs, Chair, Internal Accountability Subcommittee, stated that the subcommittee met this morning, and they approved the program evaluation plan for 2024-2025 which they will also update if needed with additional evaluation projects during the year. Mr. Jacobs stated they approved 10 junior student representative semifinalists that were recommended by the Ad-Hoc Steering Committee. Mr. Jacobs thanked the members of the committee for their work. Mr. Jacobs stated the committee reviewed and rated the 33 applications received and selected 10 semifinalists. The 10 semifinalists are: Zenaida Caquias, Gulfport School District, Gulfport High School; Noah Clapper, Madison County School District, Madison Central High School; Annsley Coleman, New Albany School District, New Albany High School; Jack Durr, Pearl Public School District, Pearl High School; Jaiden Hardy, Brookhaven School District, Brookhaven High School; Samuel Haydel, Petal School District, Petal High School; Crosby Parker, Gulfport School District, Gulfport High School; Kennedy Powell, Brookhaven School District, Brookhaven High School; Louis Schramm, Lamar County School District, Oak Grove High School; and Shruti Singh, Clinton Public School District, Clinton High School. Mr. Jacobs stated these students will be interviewed by the Internal Accountability Subcommittee on May 1 and 2 and following the interviews the subcommittee will select the top four highest scoring finalists which the Board will interview on June 19, 2024. Mr Jacobs stated the Board will select a junior student representative and an alternate after the interviews and the student representative will begin their term on July 1, 2024 and end on April 30, 2026.

Dr. Ronnie L. McGehee, Chair, School Performance and Accountability Subcommittee, stated there was no report.
