"Listen to Tito Puente playing the song "Timbal". What do you notice?"	Play a clip of 'Timbal' by Tito Puente. Children respond
"Charlie Parker is another musician. His <i>instrument</i> was the <i>saxophone</i> ."	Play a clip of 'Koko' by Charlie Parker.
"Here is a book about Charlie Parker. What do you notice about the words?"	Read a few pages <i>Charlie</i> Parker Played Bebop emphasizing the rhythm.
"The saxophone and the harmonica are instruments played by blowing air with your mouth. Other instruments that are played with your hands, like the drums, are called percussion instruments ."
