## Procedure

### Preparation: Set up materials

Show illustrations in *Oonga Boonga/Crybaby* and point out that Daniel's/Baby's family has a mother, father, brother, and grandparents. Show illustrations in *Peter's Chair* and point out that Peter's family has a father, mother, and a baby sister. Compare and contrast the two families. Ask children to draw the people in their family and label who they are. Use family photographs for children to reference.

- How is your family the same as or different from your friends' families?
- What does your family do together?
- How is what you call your \_\_\_\_\_\_ (mother, father, etc.) different from what your friends calls their \_\_\_\_\_\_ (mother, father, etc.)?
- How do the people in your family take care of each other?
