Dr. Lance Evans is currently the Superintendent of Schools for the New Albany School District. Over the past 24 years as an educator, he has served in the roles of teacher, coach, assistant principal, elementary principal and high school principal.

In 2015, he was named the Mississippi Principal of the Year. Additionally, Dr. Evans has served on the boards of Mississippi Association of School Superintendents (MASS), Mississippi Association of School Administrators (MASA) and the Governing Board for the American Association of School Administrators (AASA). He is also a member of the local Rotary Club and Kiwanis Club.

Dr. Evans believes innovation is a key component to educating students of the 21st century.
