01. <u>Information: Achievement School District Update</u> [Goals 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6 – MBE Strategic Plan]

<u>Background</u>: The Mississippi Legislature enacted Miss. Code Ann. § 37-17-17 during the 2016 Legislative Session, which created the Mississippi Achievement School District (ASD). The purpose of the ASD is to transform persistently failing schools and districts throughout the state into quality educational institutions.

The Mississippi Department of Education (MDE) formed a Task Force during 2015-16 to examine other Achievement School District models around the nation and to examine a variety of data related to districts in Mississippi. The findings of this Task Force influenced the legislation that created the Mississippi Achievement School District.

Following the passage of the Mississippi Achievement School District, the MDE formed an ASD Planning Committee to research effective ASD models for Mississippi, develop the criteria for inclusion in the first ASD and establish the qualifications for the ASD superintendent.

This item provides an update on the progress of the ASD Planning Committee and a timeline for the launch of the state's first ASD.

This item references Goals 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6 of the *Mississippi Board of Education* 2016-2020 Strategic Plan.

35 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 36 There is created the Mississippi Achievement SECTION 1. (1) School District for the purpose of transforming persistently 37 failing public schools and districts throughout the state into 38 39 quality educational institutions. The Mississippi Achievement 40 School District shall be a statewide school district, separate and distinct from all other school districts but not confined to any 41 42 specified geographic boundaries, and may be comprised of any 43 public schools or school districts in the state which, during two (2) consecutive school years, are designated an "F" school or 44 45 district by the State Board of Education under the accountability 46 rating system or which have been persistently failing and 47 chronically underperforming.

48 (2) The Mississippi Achievement School District shall be49 governed by the State Board of Education.

50 (3) The State Board of Education shall obtain suitable 51 office space to serve as the administrative office of the school 52 district.

(4) The State Board of Education shall select an individual to serve as superintendent of the Mississippi Achievement School District. The superintendent must be deemed by the board to be highly qualified with a demonstrable track record for producing results in a context relevant to that of Achievement School District schools. The superintendent of the Mississippi Achievement School District shall exercise powers and duties that

62 Each public school or district in the state which, (5)(a) 63 during each of two (2) consecutive school years or during two (2) 64 of three (3) consecutive years, receives an "F" designation by the 65 State Board of Education under the accountability rating system or has been persistently failing as defined by the State Board of 66 67 Education may be absorbed into and become a part of the 68 Mississippi Achievement School District. All eligible public 69 schools and districts shall be prioritized by the Achievement 70 School District according to criteria set by the Achievement 71 School District and publicized prior to the annual release of 72 accountability rating data. The Achievement School District shall 73 takeover only the number of schools and districts for which it has 74 the capacity to serve. prescribe the process and timetable by which the school or district shall be absorbed; however, in no event may the transfer of the school or district to the Mississippi Achievement School District be completed later than the beginning of the school year next succeeding the year during which the school or district receives the "F" designation.

91 (b) The State Board of Education shall adopt rules and
92 regulations governing the operation of the Mississippi Achievement
93 School District.

94 Designations assigned to schools or districts under (C) 95 the accountability rating system by the State Board of Education 96 before the 2015-2016 school year may not be considered in 97 determining whether a particular school or district is subject to being absorbed by the Mississippi Achievement School District. 98 During the 2017-2018 school year, any school or district receiving 99 100 an "F" designation after also being designated an "F" school or 101 district in the 2015-2016 and 2016-2017 school years may be absorbed immediately by the Mississippi Achievement School 102 103 District, upon approval of the State Board of Education.

139 (f) Upon attaining and maintaining a school or district 140 accountability rating of "C" or better under the State Department of Education's accountability rating system for five (5) 141 142 consecutive years, the State Board of Education may decide to 143 revert the absorbed school or district back to local governance, 144 provided the school or school(s) in question are not conversion charter schools. "Local governance" may include a traditional 145 school board model of governance or other new form of governance 146 147 such as mayoral control, or other type of governance. The State Board of Education shall determine the best form of local 148 149 governance and school board composition after soliciting the input 150 of local citizens and shall outline a process for establishing the 151 type of governance selected. The manner and timeline for 152 reverting a school or district back to local control shall be at 153 the discretion of the State School Board, but in no case shall it 154 exceed five (5) years.

(6) The Superintendent of the Mississippi Achievement School
District shall hire those persons to be employed as principals,
teachers and noninstructional personnel in schools or districts
absorbed into the Mississippi Achievement School District. Only

The 162 Superintendent may choose to continue the employment of any person employed in an "F" rated school when the school or district is 163 164 absorbed into the Mississippi Achievement School District; 165 alternatively, the superintendent may elect not to offer continued 166 employment to a person formerly employed at a school or district 167 that is absorbed into the Mississippi Achievement School District. 168 Any persons employed by the Achievement School District shall not be subject to Sections 37-9-101 through 37-9-113. 169

170 (7) (a) The Mississippi Achievement School District may use 171 a school building and all facilities and property that is a part 172 of a school and recognized as part of the facilities or assets of 173 the school before it is absorbed into the Mississippi Achievement School District. In addition, the Mississippi Achievement School 174 District shall have access to those additional facilities that 175 176 typically were available to that school or district, its students, faculty and staff before its absorption by the Mississippi 177 178 Achievement School District. Use of facilities by a school or 179 district in the Mississippi Achievement School District must be 180 unrestricted and free of charge. However, the Mississippi 181 Achievement School District shall be responsible for providing 182 routine maintenance and repairs necessary to maintain the 183 facilities in as good a condition as when the right of use was acquired by the Mississippi Achievement School District. 184 The

Any fixtures, improvements and tangible assets added to a school building or facility by the Mississippi Achievement School District must remain at the school or district building or facility if the school or district is returned to local governance.

(b) The State Board of Education shall include in the
rules and regulations adopted pursuant to subsection (5) of this
section specific provisions addressing the rights and
responsibilities of the Mississippi Achievement School District
relating to the real and personal property of a school or district
that is absorbed into the Mississippi Achievement School District.

(8) (a) The Mississippi Achievement School District shall
certify annually to the State Board of Education in which a
Mississippi Achievement School District school or district is
located the number of students residing in the school district

(b) Whenever an increase in funding is requested by the school board for the support of schools within a particular school district absorbed into the Achievement School District, the State Board of Education and the superintendent for the Mississippi Achievement School District shall hold a public meeting in the local municipality having jurisdiction of the absorbed school district to allow input of local residents on the matter, and

210 subsequent to the conclusion of such meeting, the board of the 211 Mississippi Achievement School District shall submit its request 212 for ad valorem increase in dollars to the local governing 213 authority having jurisdiction over the absorbed school district 214 for approval of the request for increase in ad valorem tax effort. 215 In a district in which a school or schools but not the entire 216 district is absorbed into the Achievement School District, the 217 local school district shall pay directly to the Mississippi 218 Achievement School District an amount for each student enrolled in that school equal to the ad valorem tax receipts and in-lieu 219 220 payments received per pupil for the support of the local school 221 district in which the student resides. The pro rata ad valorem 222 receipts and in-lieu receipts to be transferred to the Mississippi 223 Achievement School District shall include all levies for the 224 support of the local school district under Sections 37-57-1 (local 225 contribution to the education funding program) and 37-57-105 226 (school district operational levy) and may not include any taxes 227 levied for the retirement of the local school district's bonded 228 indebtedness or short-term notes or any taxes levied for the 229 support of vocational-technical education programs, unless the 230 school or schools absorbed include a high school at which 231 vocational-technical education programs are offered. In no event 232 may the payment exceed the pro rata amount of the local ad valorem 233 payment to the education funding program under Section 37-57-1 for 234 the school district in which the student resides. 235 under this section by a school district to the Mississippi 236 Achievement School District must be made before the expiration of 237 three (3) business days after the funds are distributed to the 238 local school district by the tax collector.

239 (C) If an entire school district is absorbed into the 240 Achievement School District, the tax collector shall pay the 241 amounts as described in paragraph (b) of this subsection, with the exception that all funds should transfer, including taxes levied 242 243 for the retirement of the local school district's bonded 244 indebtedness or short-term notes and any taxes levied for the 245 support of vocational-technical education programs. The 246 Mississippi Achievement School District shall pay funds raised to 247 retire the district's debts to the appropriate creditors on behalf 248 of the former district.

The State Department of Education shall make 249 (9) (a) 250 payments to the Mississippi Achievement School District for each 251 student in average daily memebership at a Mississippi Achievement 252 School District school equal to the state share of the education 253 funding program payments for each student in average daily 254 attendance at the local school district or former local school 255 district in which that school is located. In calculating the 256 local contribution for purposes of determining the state share of 257 the education funding program payments, the department shall 258 deduct the pro rata local contribution of the school district or

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259 former school district in which the student resides, to be 260 determined as provided in Section 37-151-7(2)(a).

261 Payments made pursuant to this subsection by the (b) 262 State Department of Education must be made at the same time and in 263 the same manner as education funding program payments are made to 264 all other school districts under Sections 37-151-101 and 265 37-151-103. Amounts payable to the Mississippi Achievement School 266 District must be determined by the State Department of Education 267 in the same manner that such amounts are calculated for all other 268 school districts under the education funding program.

(10) The Mississippi Achievement School District shall be considered a local educational agency for the same purposes and to the same extent that all other school districts in the state are deemed local educational agencies under applicable federal laws.

(11) The Mississippi Achievement School District may receive donations or grants from any public or private source, including any federal funding that may be available to the school district or individual schools within the Mississippi Achievement School District.

(12) The Legislature may appropriate sufficient funding to the State Department of Education for the 2017 fiscal year for the specific purpose of funding the start-up, operational and any other required costs of the Mississippi Achievement School District during the 2017-2018 school year.
