<u>Technical Note:</u> The proposed cost increase includes the following: New science standards are being introduced in FY18; therefore, Pearson will include new item types for the 5th and 8th grade science assessment, as well as, the Biology I end-of-course assessment. Also, included is an electronic item sampler consisting of 20 items per grade for student exposure to new item types. In addition, new test forms will be created in the areas of Biology I and U.S. History for the December test administration. Pearson will also work with the MDE to provide local school districts an early pass/fail status of Grade 12 testers on the U.S. History and Biology I end-of-course assessment. Districts will know if seniors have met all graduation requirements prior to participation in graduation exercises.
