<u>Purpose</u>: To provide funds to districts to ensure that homeless children, including preschoolers and youth, receive a free and appropriate public education and support services to eliminate barriers to academic success. Services will include, but are not limited to the provision of supplemental instruction, transportation, free school meals, enriched educational services, social services, and medical services.

<u>Eligibility</u>: All school districts within the state of Mississippi are eligible to apply.

<u>Exception:</u> The applicant has previously been cited with major and or significant deficiencies by the MDE in one or more programs.

Funding Source: Title IX, Part A of the Every Student Succeeds Act

Basis for Awarding the Grants: Competitive

Funds will be awarded based on the following methodology:

I. Base Allocation:

Each grant recipient will receive a base allocation based upon the number of grants that will be awarded. Fifty percent (50%) of the LEA reservation will be

evenly distributed among all grant recipients. The base allocation will be calculated as follows:

50% of the Total LEA Reservation to be Awarded = Base Allocation Total # Grant Recipients

II. Additional Allocation:

The funds available after the LEA base allocations are awarded will be allocated to all grant recipients on a per pupil basis. The per pupil amount will be calculated as follows:

Total Funds Available After LEA Base Allocations

Total # Homeless Students Enrolled in the Districts that are Grant Recipients

= Per Pupil Amount

The additional allocation will be calculated as follows:

Per Pupil Amount x # Homeless Students Enrolled = Amount of Additional Allocation

The methodology will be reviewed periodically to determine if revisions are necessary as a result of changes in funding or changes in the law.

<u>Funding Source</u>: Federal Section 722(f) requires states to allocate no less than 75 percent of the amount reserved for McKinney-Vento Education for Homeless Children Youth Program to LEAs. <u>Title IX</u>, Part A of the Every Student Succeeds Act

Basis for Awarding the Grants: Competitive

Funds will be awarded based on the following methodology:

I. Base Allocation:

Each district-grant recipient will receive a base allocation based upon the number of grants that will be awarded. Fifty percent (50%) of the <u>LEA reservation amount to be awarded to districts</u> will be evenly distributed among all grant recipients. The base <u>amountallocation</u> will be calculated as follows:

50% of the Total LEA Allocation Reservation to be Awarded = Base Allocation

-Total # Grant Recipients

II. Additional Allocation:

— The funds available after the <u>LEA</u> base reallocations are awarded (50% of the amount to be awarded) will be allocated to all grant recipients on a per pupil basis. The per pupil amount will be calculated as follows:

Total Funds aAvailable After LEA Base Allocations

(50% of awarded allocation)

—Total # Homeless Students Enrolled in the Districts that are Grant Recipients

= Per Pupil Amount

The additional allocation will be calculated as follows:

Per Pupil Amount x # Homeless Students Enrolled = Amount of Additional Allocation

The methodology will be reviewed annually periodically to determine if revisions are necessary as a result of changes in funding or changes in the law. Revisions to the methodology will be presented for Board approval.
