DOUGHS

No-Cook Playdough 1 cup flour 1/3 cup salt 1/2 cup water 2 teaspoons canola oil

Mix the dry ingredients, then slowly pour in the wet ingredients. Knead until smooth and store in a covered container. Add a few drops of food coloring to the wet ingredients before adding to the dry.

<u>The Best Cooked Playdough</u> 1 cup flour 1 cup water

1/2 cup salt 2 teaspoons cream of tartar 1 tablespoon oil food coloring.

Combine flour, salt, and cream of tartar in a saucepan. Mix liquids and gradually stir them into dry ingredients. Cook over medium heat, stirring constantly until a ball forms. Remove from heat and knead until smooth.

Baker's Clay 4 cups flour 1 cup salt ¾ cup water

Combine ingredients. Knead for 4-6 minutes. *Optional:* Bake at 300 degrees for an hour, paint after cooled.

SENSORY

<u>Goop</u> 2 cups salt 2/3 cup water 1 cup cornstarch 1/2 cup cold water.

Mix salt and water, over heat for 3-4 minutes. Remove from heat and quickly add cornstarch and cold water. Stir quickly. Return to heat briefly if mixture becomes too "goopy".

<u>Slime</u>

2 oz Sta Flo Liquid Laundry Starch 4 oz of Elmers School Glue or any non-washable type

Add the entire bottle of glue to a bowl. Slowly add Sta Flo laundry starch to the glue, mixing well between additions. Knead until ball-like. Add liquid starch if it becomes sticky. Store in a ziploc bag in the refrigerator.



Moon Sand 5 cups of all purpose white flour 1 Cup of baby oil <u>Bubble Solution</u>
2/3 cup of Joy dishwashing soap
3 tablespoons glycerin (found in the pharmacy department)
1 gallon water

Rinse out a gallon jug. Measure out the ingredients above into the jug. Replace the jug cap and shake until completely mixed. Let the solution sit for a day or more before use.

Pour the bubble solution into shallow containers to use. Give the solution a gentle shake before each use.

PAINTS

<u>Puffy Paint</u> shaving cream Elmers glue food coloring or paint Mix an equal amount of shaving cream and glue. Add a few drops of food coloring or paint to the mixture.

Liquid Sidewalk Chalk 1/4 cup cornstarch 1/4 cup water food coloring

Pour the cornstarch and cold water into a medium mixing bowl, and stir until well blended and lumps have disappeared. Pour the liquid into separate containers.

Salt Paint 2 tsp. salt 1 tsp. liquid starch food coloring Mix ingredients together. The salt gives a frosted or sandy appearance to the paint.
