Background Information: In accordance with 34 C.F.R. 200.19(b) and Miss. Code Ann. § 37-17-6, the 2025 graduation and dropout rates were calculated following the four-year adjusted cohort method. This method determines the high school completion status for students four (4) years after entering Grade 9 for the first time during the school year (SY) 2020-2021 (Seniors SY 2023-2024) and graduated within the cohort window which ended July 31, 2024.

Also, included are the 2025 dropout rates for all students and the graduation and dropout rates for students with disabilities.

Background

In accordance with 34 C.F.R. § 200.19(b) and Miss. Code Ann. § 37-17-6, graduation and dropout rates were calculated following the four-year adjusted cohort method. This method determines the high school completion status for students four (4) years after entering Grade 9 for the first time during the school year (SY) 2020 - 2021 (Seniors SY 2023 - 2024) and graduated within the cohort window which ended July 31, 2024.

Technical Notes:

- The report includes graduation and dropout rates for 146 districts that served students who enrolled in Grade 9 for the first time during SY 2020 - 2021.
- The Chickasaw County School District and the Houston Municipal Separate School District consolidated to the Chickasaw County School District[†] effective July 1, 2021. Districts that consolidated after the beginning of the cohort window do not yet have rates comparable to other districts, as their cohort may be split into the consolidated district and prior districts, based on student enrollment.
- State special schools and charter schools are included and reported as a district, as they contribute to the overall state graduation rate. These include Mississippi School of the Arts, Mississippi Schools for the Blind and Deaf, Mississippi School for Math and Science, Williams School, Roger Amos McMurtry School, and Smilow Prep.
- Two asterisks (**) indicate the district or school did not meet the minimum n-count for the calculation of the graduation or dropout rate.
- Districts or schools with a graduation rate less than 5% are reported as 5%. Districts or schools with a dropout rate greater than 95.0% are reported as 95.0%.

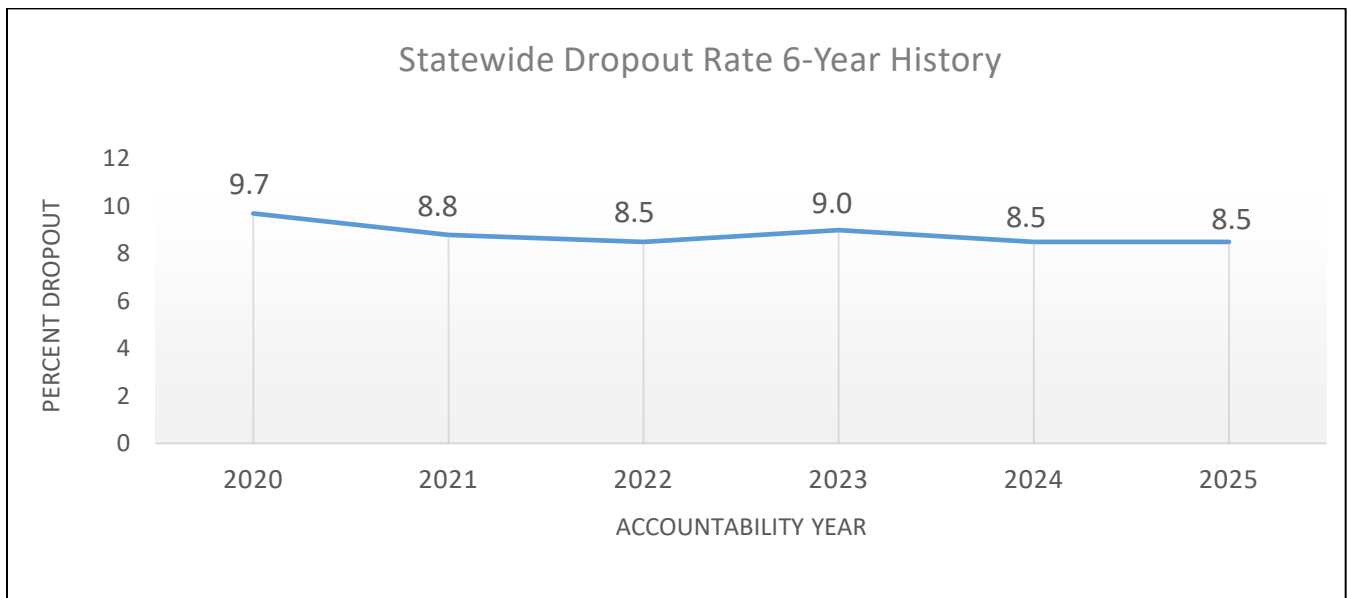
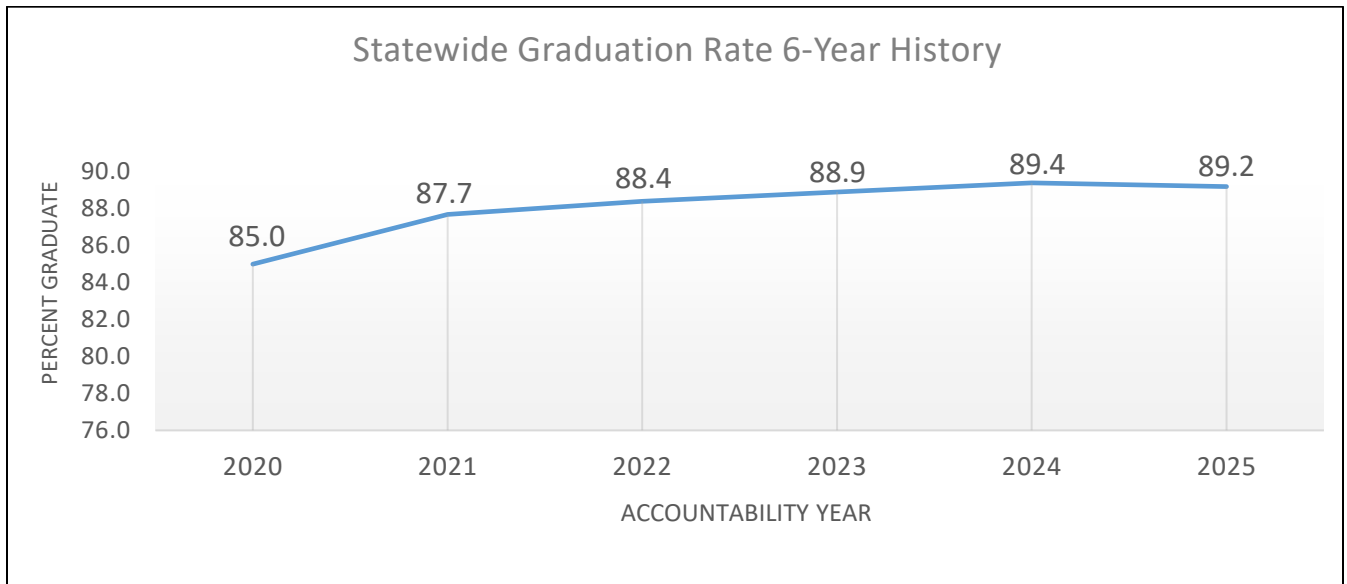

State Level Graduation and Dropout Rates by Subgroup

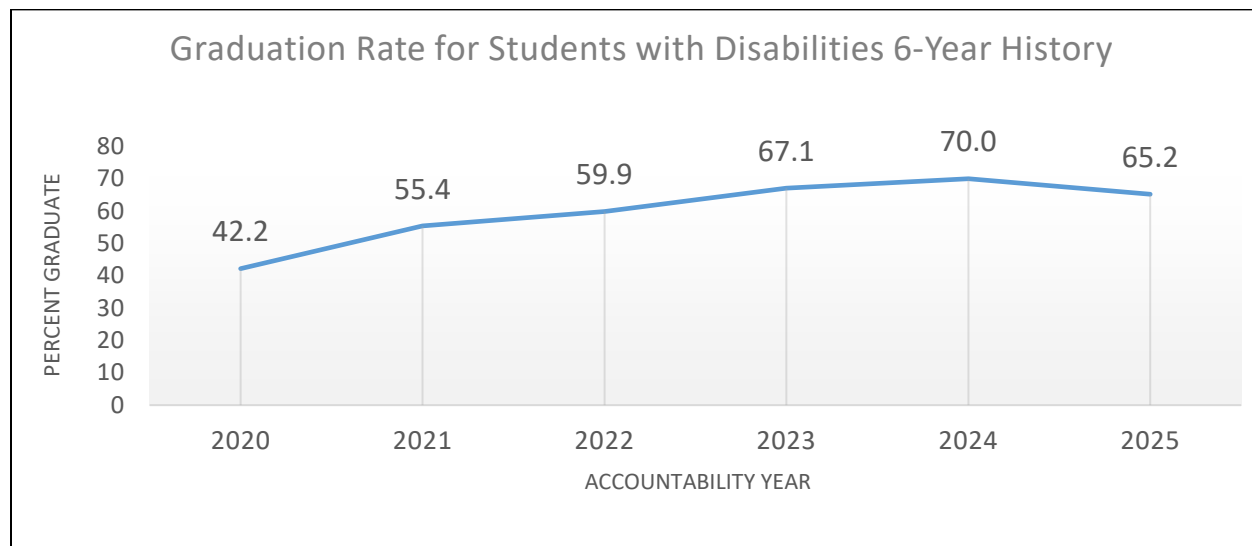

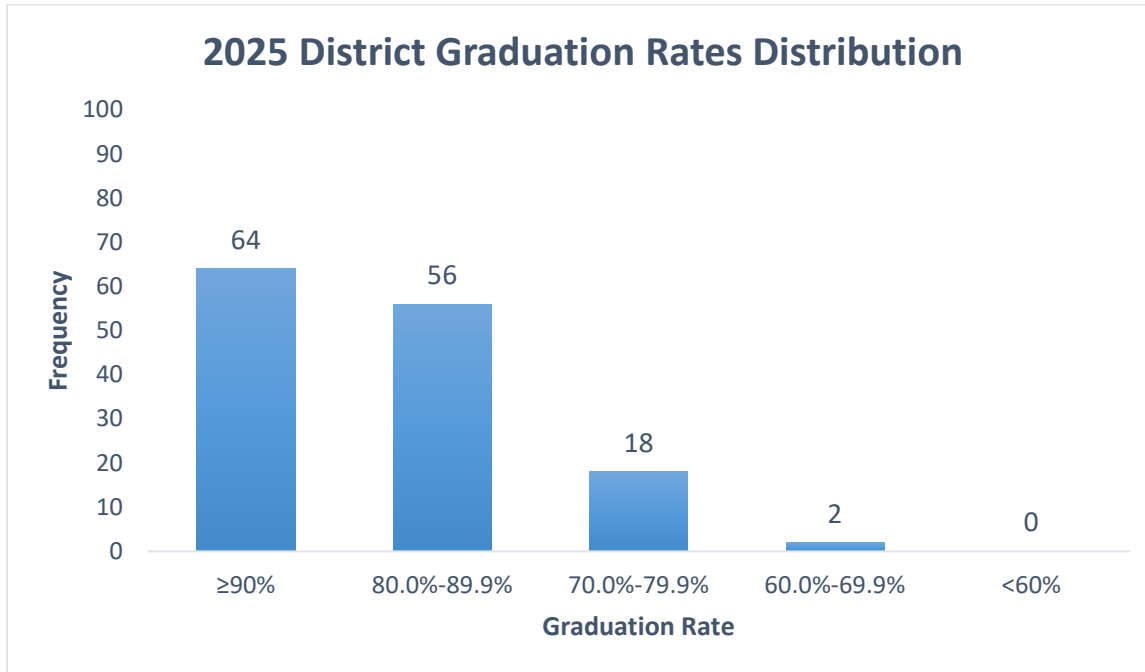

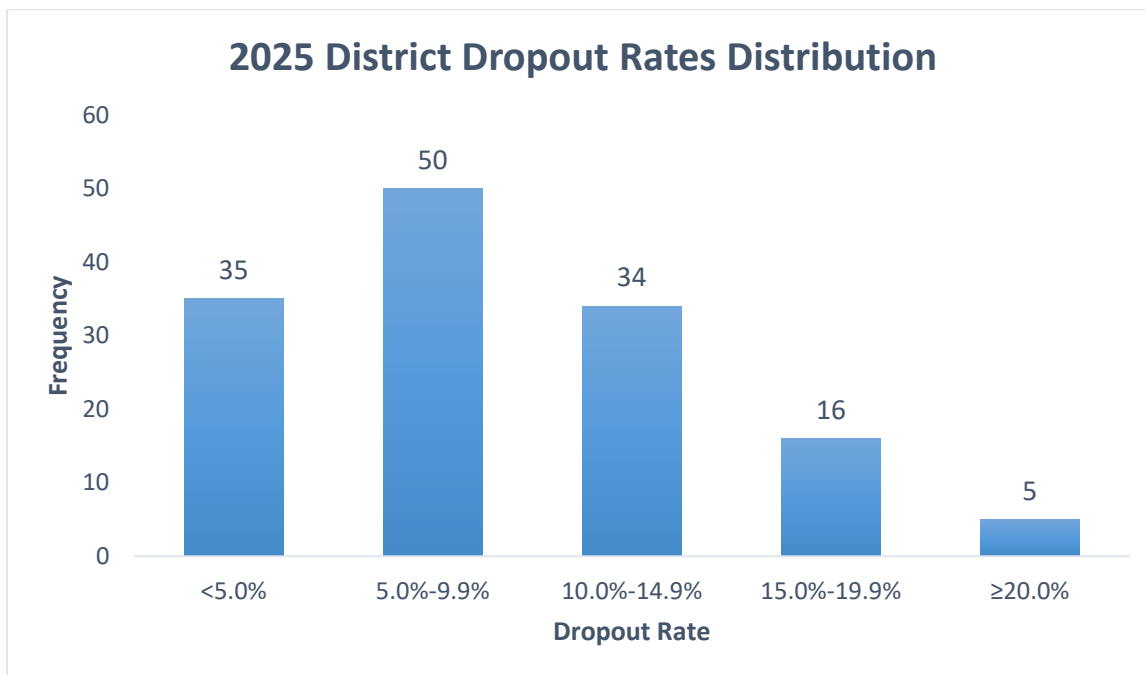

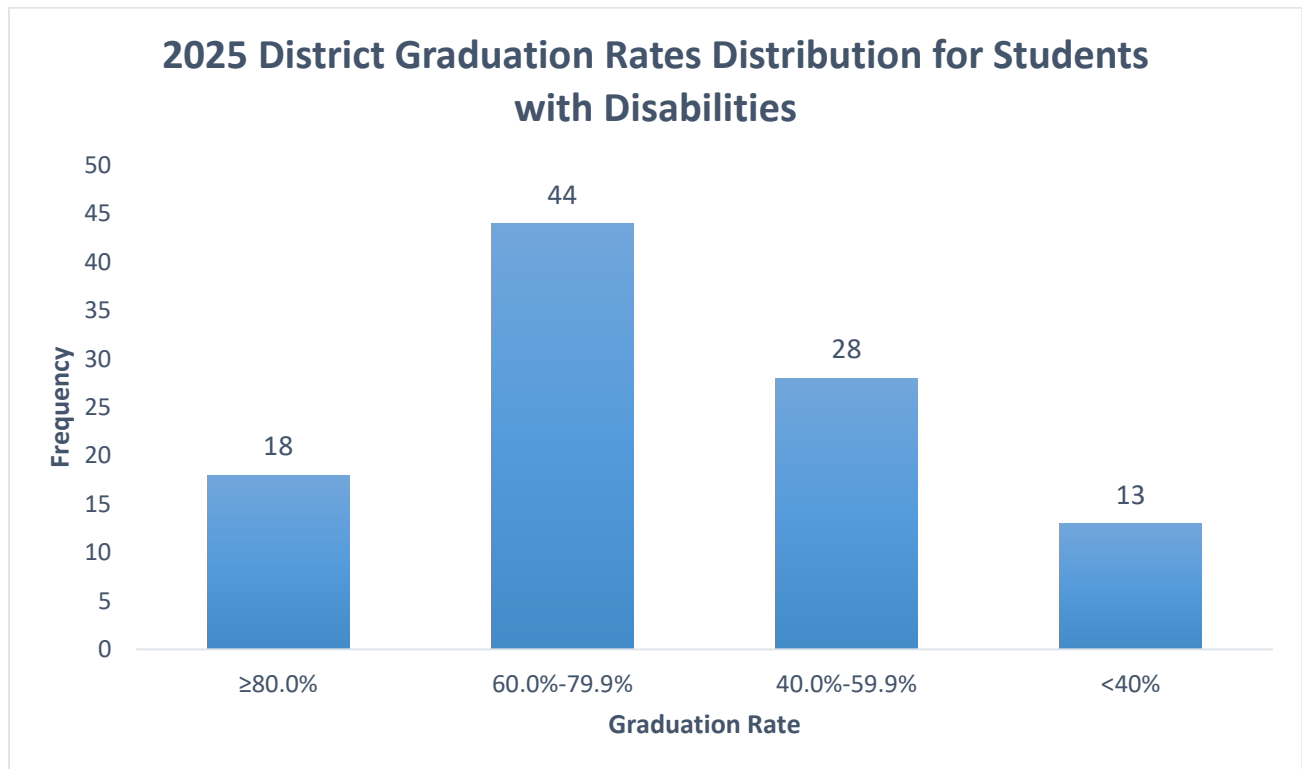
