J. <u>Approval of Belhaven University's initial-level preparation programs as a</u> result of state standards-based educator preparation program reviews and national accreditation decisions

<u>Background Information:</u> In accordance with Miss. Code Ann. § 37-3-2 there is established within the Mississippi Department of Education (MDE) the Commission on Teacher and Administrator Education, Certification and Licensure and Development. It shall be the purpose and duty of the Commission to make recommendations to the Mississippi Board of Education regarding standards for the certification and licensure and continuing professional development of those who teach or perform tasks of an educational nature in the public schools of Mississippi.

On January 10, 2025, at its regular meeting the Commission on Teacher and Administrator Education, Certification and Licensure and Development granted approval of initial-level preparation programs for Belhaven University based on the results of MDE's state-standards based educator preparation program reviews and the Council for the Accreditation of Educator Preparation (CAEP) national accreditation decisions.

3.1 MDE Program Review Recommendation

Comments: Initial review findings were sent to the EPP on July 12, 2021. Findings cited: limited information on how the program equips candidates for licensure preparation, gaps in using diverse instructional materials, insufficient evidence of data-informed instruction to meet the needs of varying student abilities, and concerns regarding the integration of technology. More broadly, the findings indicated a need for clarity on how the program supports candidates in fulfilling professional responsibilities as well as how data analysis is used to inform program improvement.

Initial findings from the Educational Leadership programs noted information was lacking on how the program prepares candidates to identify relevant data for school improvement and decision-making; how candidates develop strategies that align with a school's vision, mission, and core values; and how candidates are equipped to use the Professional Growth System (PGS) rubric as well as school safety data. Furthermore, the review found inadequate evidence of shared partnerships with Local Education Agencies (LEAs) and noted the absence of a comprehensive five-year recruitment plan.

The EPP submitted evidence in the rejoinders to address program deficiencies cited which resulted in all standards being met for all programs

Based upon the findings in this report, the Division of Educator Preparation recommends to the Commission on Teacher and Administrator Education, Certification and Licensure and Development full state approval through 3/15/2028 with a full review of all programs to be conducted during the 2026-2027 academic year.
