Minutes of Mississippi Board of Education Meeting

March 20, 2025

The members of the Mississippi Board of Education met at 10:00 a.m. on Thursday, March 20, 2025, pursuant to Miss. Code Ann. § 25-41-5 for the purpose of conducting a regularly scheduled Board meeting.

The public accessed this meeting via livestream or in-person at the Central High School Building, 4th Floor Boardroom, 359 North West Street, Jackson, Mississippi. Board members physically present included: Mr. Glen V. East, Dr. Wendi Barrett (joined the meeting at 10:06 a.m.), Mr. Bill Jacobs (joined the meeting at 10:08 a.m.), Mr. Matt Mayo, Mr. Matt Miller, and Dr. Ronnie L. McGehee. Board member attending virtually: Ms. Mary Werner (Saltillo, Mississippi). Board members absent: Mr. Mike Pruitt and Ms. Billye Jean Stroud. Student Representative attending virtually: Ms. Kate Riddle (Oxford, Mississippi). Student Representative present: Mr. Crosby Parker. Dr. Lance Evans, State Superintendent, was also present.

- I. Mr. Glen V. East called the Board meeting to order at 10:00 a.m., after determining that a quorum of the Board existed for the purpose of conducting a meeting.
- II. Mr. Matt Miller led the Pledge of Allegiance and Mr. Glen V. East gave the Invocation.
- III. On a motion by Dr. Ronnie L. McGehee, seconded by Ms. Mary Werner, the Board unanimously approved the minutes of February 20, 2025 Board meeting.
- IV. On a motion by Mr. Matt Mayo, seconded by Dr. Ronnie L. McGehee, the Board approved the agenda as presented.
- V. No Recognition Ceremony.
- VI. Dr. Lance Evans gave the following report as the State Superintendent of Education:
 - Dr. Evans acknowledged the news report about President Trump's plans to sign an executive order to dismantle the U.S. Department of Education. Dr. Evans stated MDE will continue to provide support and technical assistance to districts as needed to ensure all Mississippi students have access to quality education opportunities.
 - Dr. Evans stated there are many bills in conference, including the MDE Appropriation bill and March 27 is the deadline to concur on general bills. He stated that Sunday, April 6 is Sine Die.
 - Dr. Evans stated that Mr. Bill Jacobs has been reconfirmed as a State Board of Education member and Ms. Erin Meyer was confirmed to the Mississippi Charter School Authorizer Board.

- Dr. Evans stated he, Mr. Bill Jacobs, Ms. Holly Spivey, Mr. Mike Pruitt, and Dr. Ronnie L. McGehee met with Lt. Governor Delbert Hosemann for a lunch meeting to discuss several education initiatives.
- Dr. Evans stated the second meeting of the Superintendent's Advisory Council met and discussed proposed changes to the accountability system, potential education legislation, and to get feedback on MDE initiatives.
- Dr. Evans stated he had meetings with partner organizations and stakeholders, including:
 - Mississippi Association of Colleges of Teacher Education (MACTE); and
 - Leveling Up Mississippi.
- Dr. Evans stated he had a speaking engagement at the Mississippi School Boards Association Conference.
- Dr. Evans stated he hosted members of the Pearl River High School Student Council as part of their field trip to the Capitol. Dr. Evans stated he shared information about the role of MDE and the State Board in supporting school districts throughout the state.
- Dr. Evans stated he and Mr. John Ferrell visited the Golden Triangle Early College High School (GTECHS) on the Mayhew campus of East Mississippi Community College (EMCC). Dr. Evans stated that GTECHS opened in the fall of 2015 as Mississippi's first early college high school and is the result of a partnership between MDE, Mississippi State University, and EMCC.
- Dr. Evans stated he, Mr. John Ferrell, Ms. Wendy Clemons, and Ms. Heather Morrison visited with the Junior Achievement of Memphis, and they will be opening a branch in Mississippi. Dr. Evans stated the primary reason for the visit is MDE is working with workforce development and financial literacy. Dr. Evans stated that Junior Achievement's work centers around early learning through high school financial literacy and a lot of the programming they have can be implemented across our state to utilize their resources.
- Dr. Evans stated MDE is conducting interviews for the Chief Operations Officer position.
- Dr. Evans stated this would be Dr. Donna H. Boone's last Board meeting. He thanked Dr. Boone for her service to MDE over the past two years.
- Dr. Evans thanked Ms. Tamala Matthews for her service to MDE. He stated this would be her last day at MDE.

On a motion by Mr. Matt Mayo, seconded by Mr. Matt Miller, the Board unanimously voted to come out of Executive Session.

No changes to the location or operation of MSMS will occur without legislative action and appropriation of necessary funding.

Mr. East stated the April Board meeting will be held on April 17, 2025 in Jackson, MS at the Central High School Building in the 4th Floor Boardroom starting at 10:00 a.m.
