07.C. Action: Award competitive grants for the Mississippi Community Oriented Policing Services in Schools (MCOPS) Grant FY 26 (2025-2026) [Goal 2 – MBE Strategic Plan]

<u>Background and Purpose</u>: Mississippi Code Annotated § 37-3-82 established the Mississippi Community Oriented Policing Services in Schools (MCOPS) Grant program for the utilization of School Resource Officers (SRO) within the K-12 education system. The law allocates a minimum of \$10,000 per officer for Districts to pay for the salary and benefits of School Resource Officers. The funding must be matched from local funds on a 50/50 matching basis.

Scope of Grant:

• Grant Period: July 1, 2025 – June 30, 2026

(With a liquidation period ending July 13, 2026)

Award Amount: \$1,820,000

Method of Award: Request for Application

Funding Source: State Funds

Summary of Selection Process:

An application and priority point process was utilized to award grants.
