01. Information: Report of the 2026 graduation rates for the state, district, and school levels [Goal 2 – MBE Strategic Plan]

Background Information: In accordance with 34 C.F.R. 200.19(b) and Miss. Code Ann. § 37-17-6, the 2026 graduation and dropout rates were calculated following the four-year adjusted cohort method. This method determines the high school completion status for students four (4) years after entering Grade 9 for the first time during the school year (SY) 2021-2022 (Seniors SY 2024-2025) and graduated within the cohort window which ended July 31, 2025.

Also, included are the 2026 dropout rates for all students and the graduation and dropout rates for students with disabilities.

This item references Goal 2 of the *Mississippi Board of Education Strategic Plan*.

Background

In accordance with ESSA § 1111(c)(4)(B)(iii)(I) and Miss. Code Ann. § 37-17-6, graduation and dropout rates were calculated following the four-year adjusted cohort method. This method determines the high school completion status for students four (4) years after entering Grade 9 for the first time during the school year (SY) 2021 - 2022 (Seniors SY 2024 - 2025) and graduating within the cohort window, which ended July 31, 2025.

- Districts or schools with a graduation rate less than 5% are reported as 5%. Districts or schools with a dropout rate greater than 95.0% are reported as 95.0%.











