Percentile Rank Explanation and Kindergarten Readiness Literacy Classifications

The Kindergarten Readiness Assessment (KRA) will provide families, teachers, and early childhood providers with a common understanding of what children know and are able to do upon entering school. The primary purpose of the Kindergarten Readiness Assessment is to improve the quality of classroom instruction and other services provided to students from birth to 3rd grade. STAR Early Literacy, developed by Renaissance Learning, Inc., is the assessment administered to provide educators with this information.

≥ 56 PR Cut Score Explanation

The MDE and Renaissance are implementing a revised proficiency benchmark for the Kindergarten Readiness Assessment establishing the **56th percentile rank** as the cut score indicator for academic proficiency. Renaissance completed a linking study using a longitudinal sample of 17,134 kindergarten students who took Star Early Literacy in August and September of 2021 and also took the Mississippi Academic Assessment Program as third graders in April or May of 2025 to determine cut scores linked to 3rd grade proficiency (Levels 4 and 5). This benchmark revision represents the culmination of comprehensive research, extensive stakeholder consultation, and rigorous data analysis. The MDE and Renaissance are committed to using evidence-based decisions, leading us to adopt this research-supported standard that better represents student readiness and achievement. The 56th percentile rank falls in the Early Emergent Reader Performance Level for the beginning of the year.

Performance Level	Scale Score Range	Descriptors			
Early Emergent Reader	200-682	Students are beginning to understand that printed text has meaning. The students are learning that reading involves printed words and sentences, and that print flows from left to right and from the top to the bottom of the page. The students are also beginning to identify colors, shapes, numbers, and letters.			
Late Emergent Reader	683-785	Students can identify most of the letters of the alphabet and can match most of the letters to their sounds. The students are beginning to read picture books and familiar words around their home. Through repeated reading of favorite books with an adult, students at this stage are building their vocabularies, listening skills, and understandings of print.			
Early Transitional Reader	786-815	Students have mastered alphabet skills and letter-sound relationships. The students can identify many beginning and ending consonant sounds and long and short vowel sounds.			
Late Transitional Reader	816-851	Students are probably able to blend sounds and word parts to read simple words. The students are likely using a variety of strategies to figure out words, such as pictures, story patterns, and phonics.			
Probable Reader	852-1100	Students are becoming proficient at recognizing many words, both in and out of context. The students spend less time identifying and sounding out words and more time understanding what he or she has read. Probable readers can start to blend sounds and word parts to read words and sentences more quickly, smoothly, and independently.
