





Regular Courses

New Course Code Request

LEAs that need a course that is not available must submit a Course Code Request Form. This is a REQUEST and is subject to final approval or denial from MDE Leadership.

Requests for the following school year must be submitted by **October 1st of the current school year** (Ex.: Requests for SY '27-'28 must be submitted by October 1, 2026).

MS Online Course Approval (MOCA)

Online Courses

For courses to be approved for use as online classes, local school districts must apply to the MDE for approval to ensure the vendor/provider's content, curriculum, and assessments are aligned to Mississippi's course standards.

Requests for the following school year must be submitted by **September 1st of the current school year** (Ex.: Requests for SY '27-'28 must be submitted by September 1, 2026). This is a request and subject to review and approval or denial by the Office of Curriculum & Instruction.

Vendors/providers of online classes may **NOT** submit applications directly to the MDE. The local school district will submit applications.

Reminders for Scheduling Students

Any course for which a student can earn a Carnegie unit reflects a grade span of **7-12 for regular courses** and **9-12 for accelerated courses** (Advanced Placement, IB, Dual Credit, etc.).

Exceptions are courses which are grade-specific due to board policy or legislative mandate.

Grade spans indicate *availability* while course descriptions inform *appropriateness* and *accessibility*.
