Mississippi K Readiness Assessment Test Administration Manual



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Introduction

This manual provides general information about the K Readiness Assessment and specific guidelines for administering the test. Test administrators and teachers should carefully read and review the contents of this manual prior to testing to ensure the highest levels of test fidelity.

About Star Early Literacy

Star Early Literacy is a customized reading test for students to take on a computer. The test is designed for students in grades pre-K through 3 (beginning readers who do not yet read independently or need early literacy skills assessed). As a student takes the assessment, the software selects items based on the student's responses. If the student answers the item correctly, the software increases the difficulty level of the next item. If the student answers incorrectly, the software lowers the difficulty level of the next item. By continually adjusting the difficulty of an item to what the student has shown she can or cannot do, the assessment is tailored to accurately measure each student's level of achievement. Star Early Literacy consists of 27 items and generally takes fewer than 15 minutes for the student to complete the assessment.

Computer-Adaptive Test and Scaled Score

A computer-adaptive test creates a virtually unlimited number of test forms as it dynamically interacts with the student taking the test. A scaled score (SS) is the student's score on the assessment. It is used to report performance for all students on a consistent scale. To make the results of all tests comparable, it is necessary to convert all results of the tests to scores on a common scale. The *complete* Unified Scaled Score range is from 0–1400; Star Early Literacy scores on that scale range from 200–1100.

Test Security Overview

Security is a concern in any testing situation, and sound testing procedures are the hallmark of test security. When teachers and test administrators consistently follow the procedures presented in this manual before, during, and after testing, they help ensure test results which are true representations of student achievement.

Additionally, test security safeguards are built in to Star's computer-adaptive test design. It is highly unlikely any two students will see the same test items at the same time. This is because Star assessments are computer-adaptive based on individual student performance, and test items are selected from a large pool of items.

Prior to Testing

Preparation for testing is a key component of test fidelity. We recommend that test administrators and/or teachers complete the following tasks prior to testing.

- ☐ Read this Test Administration Manual thoroughly and carefully.
- ☐ Attend training on school test security procedures.
- ☐ **DTCs/STCs** create a schedule for testing. Try to avoid distracting locations or times when other students, school bells, or public address announcements can interfere with student concentration. Provide a copy of the schedule to each person involved with testing.
- ☐ Make sure there is enough light and ventilation in the test area, and that the room is at a comfortable temperature.
- ☐ Ensure all testing devices are working properly. If you are administering the test with a tablet or laptop, make sure the battery is adequately charged before testing.
- ☐ Make sure the computer or tablet has a set of headphones plugged in and that the volume is set so the student can hear the audio clearly without disturbing other students.
- ☐ Arrange the desks or computer workstations so that students have enough room to work on the test.
- ☐ **DTCs/STCs** access students' user names and passwords (see the instructions for creating and printing a Student Password Report at <https://short.renaissance.com/B5WlaA>. It is important to note that teachers can only search for students in their own classes. If you choose to print this information, be sure it is stored in a secure location before and during testing and destroyed after testing.
- ☐ **DTCs/STCs** check the settings for all preferences that apply to Star Early Literacy (see "Students may encounter these messages while taking the test. This section describes what each message means and next steps. Many common technical issues can be avoided by adhering to the Renaissance Technical Recommendations." on page 21).
- ☐ Follow the school test security plan for other test security requirements.
- ☐ **DTCs/STCs** make sure you have the correct monitor password if it is required (see "Help Links" on page 33).
- ☐ Use the Student Images section to make handouts or to project for students to help them more clearly understand the test format when you conduct the Test Format Overview (see page 4).

Day of Testing

- ☐ Use “Test Format Overview and Administration Procedure” on page 4 to familiarize students with what a Star Early Literacy test looks like. The text included in the “Teacher Notes for Student Images” section beginning on page 7 is a guide to use with students as you discuss the pictures.
- ☐ Follow school test procedures for what students do after testing.
- ☐ On the computers or tablets used for testing, start the browser and use the bookmark to go to the Renaissance address (URL). On the Welcome page, select **I’m a Student**.
- ☐ We recommend enabling “full screen” mode on your browser to ensure no scrolling is required. Browsers with customizations (bookmark tabs, extensions, etc.) and low-resolution screen settings result in a smaller available space which could result in needing to scroll to see the **Next** button during testing.
- ☐ Follow school testing procedures for bathroom breaks.

Test Format Overview and Administration Procedure

If you are using a seating chart, make sure all the students are seated correctly. Read aloud, word for word, the material printed in the “Read Out Loud” sections. You may repeat the directions as needed. Text in *italic font* is information meant for you and should not be read to students.

Read Out Loud

Today you will take a test. There are 27 questions on the test. Don’t worry if someone finishes the test before you because every test is different.

Some of the questions will be easy, while others will be more challenging. Don’t worry about how many questions you think you get right or how many you think you get wrong. Everyone will likely miss some of the questions. The main goal is for you to do the best you can.

If you do not know the answer to a question, go ahead and choose what you think is the best answer.

Remember that once you have selected your answer, you will need to select **Next** to move on to the next question. You can change your answer choice before you select **Next** but not after. Once you move on to the next question you cannot go back.

Pause for questions.

Skip this paragraph for students who are taking the test with the “unlimited time” accommodation—see page 35. If you see a picture of a clock at the top of the screen, time is almost up for that question. Choose your best answer and select **Next** to move on to the next question. If you do not choose an answer in time, you will see a message that says time is up for that question. The next question will appear in a few seconds.

Pause for questions.

You will see a message that tells you when you have finished the test.

Add your own instructions for what students should do when they have finished the test:

Pause to answer any questions students may have. Be sure all students know their user names and passwords before moving to the steps for logging in to the test.

*Instruct students to pause and wait for instructions after each step in the login process to ensure no one rushes ahead. **Note:** Follow your district or school’s login procedures if you log in another way.*

On the student's computer:

1. Make sure the Renaissance address (URL) provided by your district is open in the browser.
2. On the Welcome page, select **I'm a Student**.
3. Either you or the student should enter the student's user name and password.
4. Select **Log In**.
5. Make sure the student's initials are at the top right of the screen inside a circle. If you see different initials, select the circle, then select **Log Out**. This will return you to the login screen so you can try again.

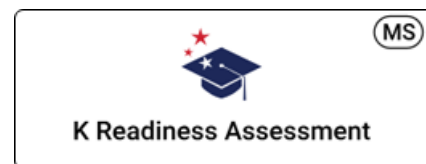
When all students are ready to begin, continue.

Read Out Loud (for Mississippi Tests Tile Only)

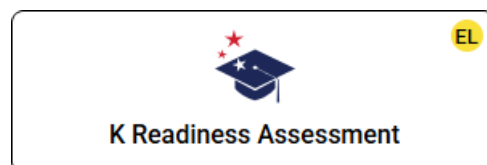
All students should use the Mississippi Test Tile during the required screening windows. Teachers may support students with selecting the correct test tile, if needed:

Select the **K Readiness Assessment** tile with the **MS** in the corner, which is at the top of the screen. Do not select the Star tiles at the bottom of the screen.

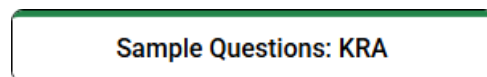


Next, select the **K Readiness Assessment** tile with the yellow **EL** in the corner.

*If a student is enrolled in more than one class that has Star Early Literacy assigned to it and that is administering the Star Early Literacy test, they will be asked to choose a class. They should select a class from the list that appears and then select **Next**.*

Read Out Loud

If you have any questions about this test, please ask them now. You can ask for help before you start the test. Once the test starts, I will not be able to help you with any questions or tell you if you have picked the right answer. Remember to stay in your seat when you have completed your test. If there is something you need, raise your hand and I will come to help you. Do not talk to anyone while others are still taking the test.

Are there any questions?

Enter the monitor password, if it is required.

You may select **Start** and begin. Do your best!

The test administrator and proctor must remain in the room during the entire test session and monitor students while testing. The testing session is ended when all students have completed the assessment. Check all testing devices to ensure all students have completed the test and screens have returned to the Login page.

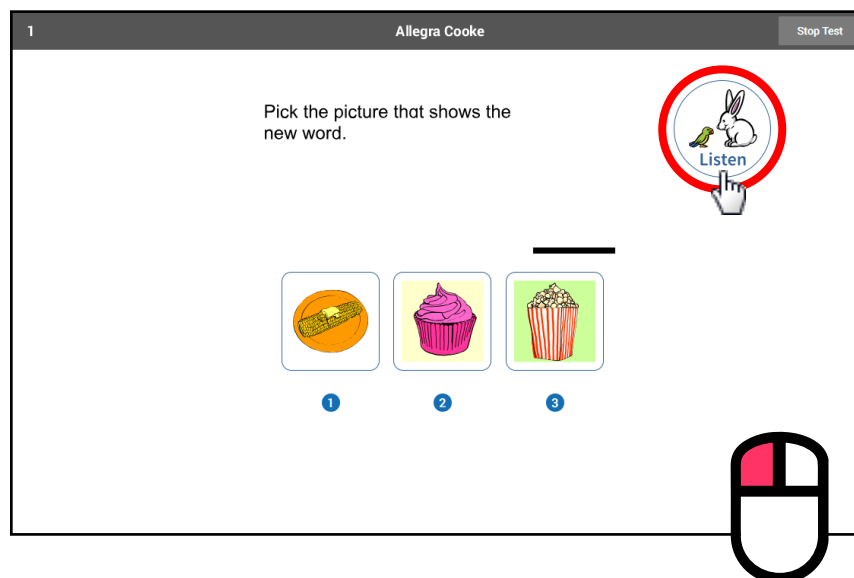

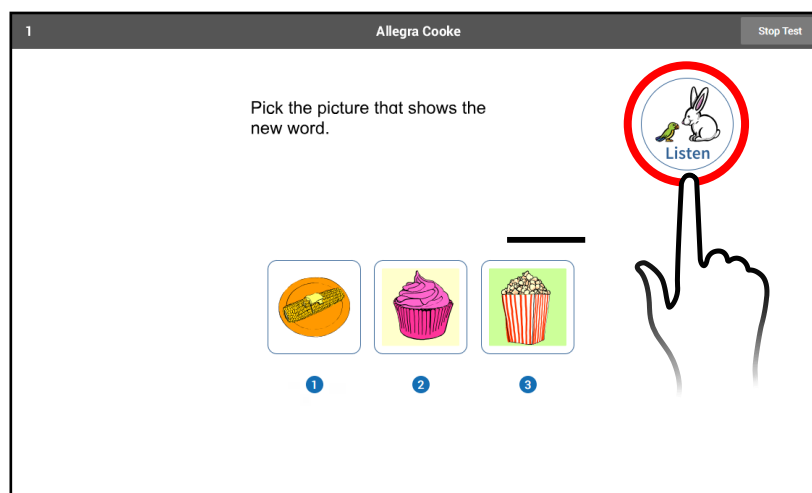
Read Out Loud

*For students using a mouse, show picture 1a: Click **Listen**.*

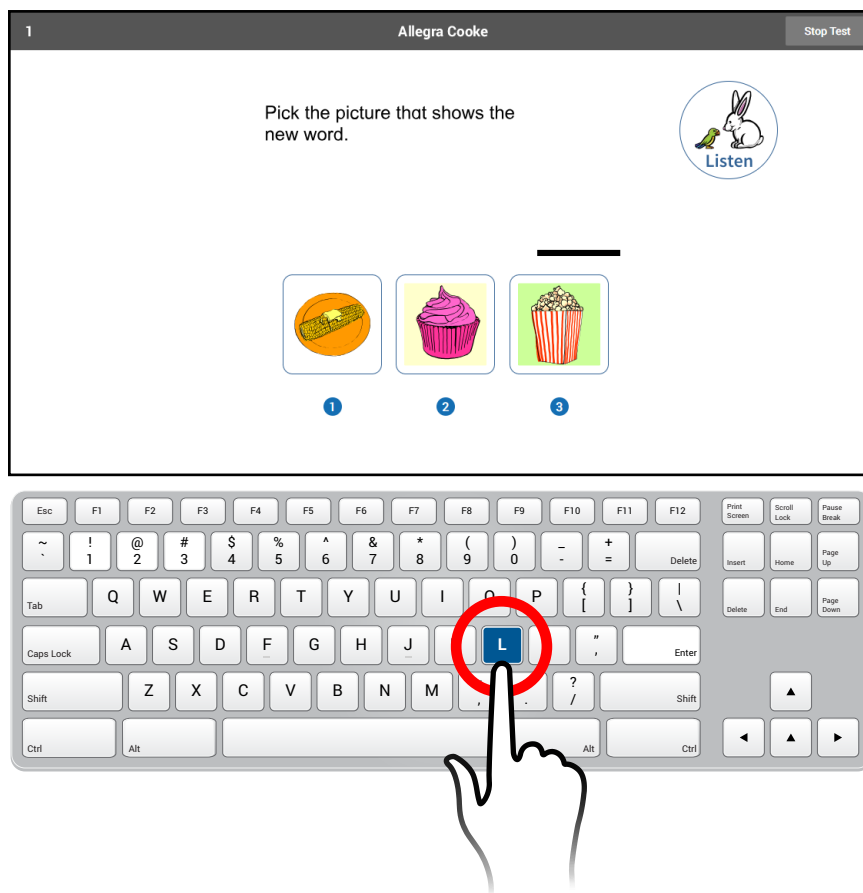

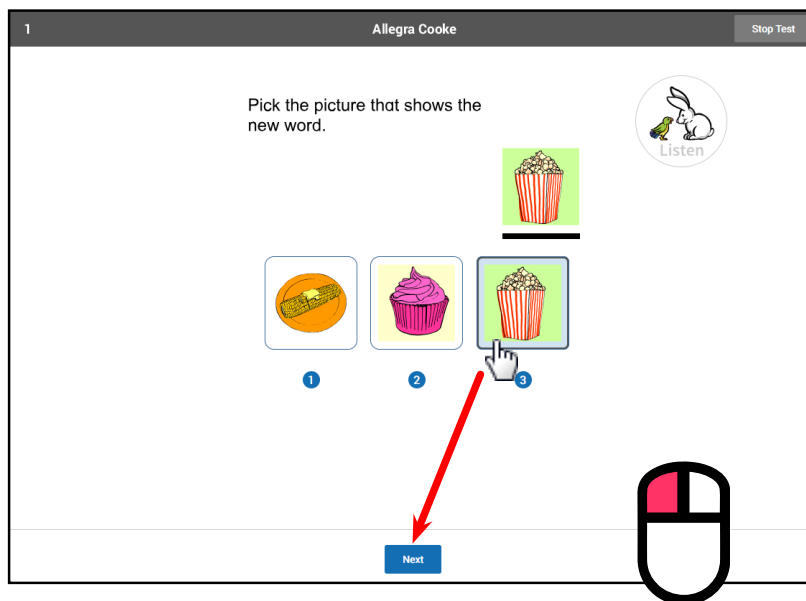

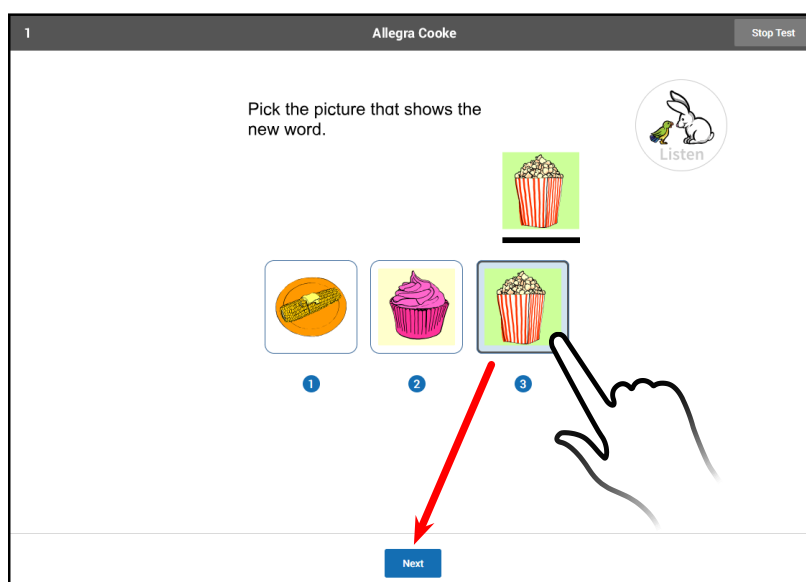

Read Out Loud

For students using a keyboard, show picture 2c: Each possible answer has a number below it (1, 2, or 3). Press the number on the keyboard that matches the number of your answer choice. If you want to choose a different answer, press the number that matches your new choice.

When you choose an answer, a box appears around it. This shows you which answer you chose; it does *not* mean you have chosen the correct answer.

Once you are satisfied with the answer you have chosen, enter it by pressing the **Enter** or **return** key.

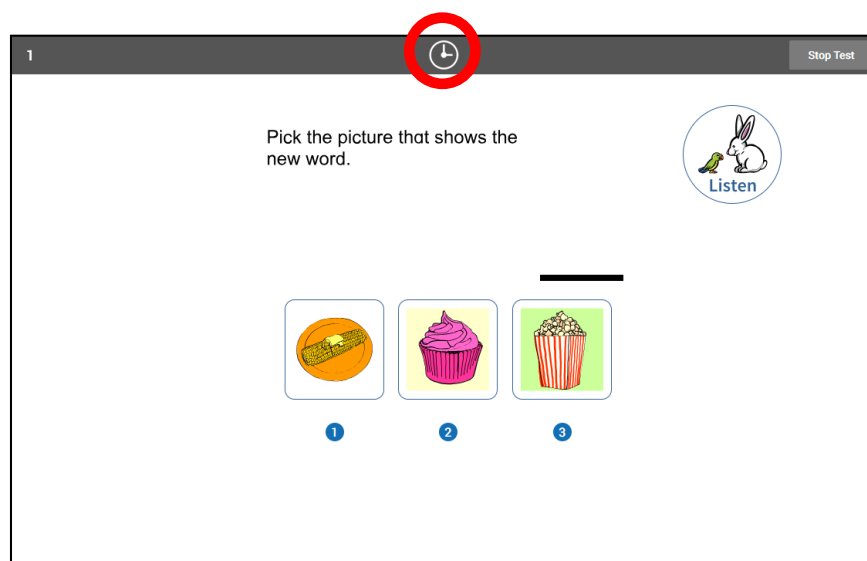

If you see a picture of a clock at the top of the screen, time is almost up for that question. Choose your answer quickly. If you do not choose an answer in time, the test will move on to the next question.

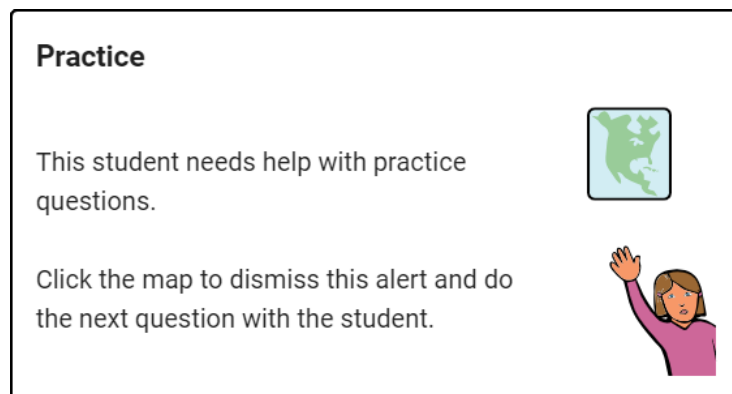

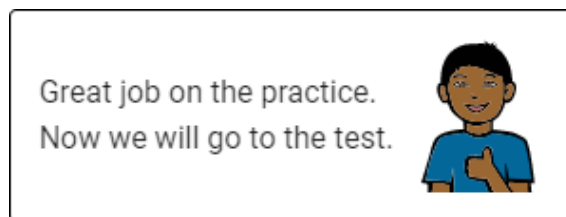
Read Out Loud (before the first testing window of the school year ONLY)

Before you take the test, you will see some practice questions. The practice questions look just like the real test questions.

If you see this message during the practice questions, you should raise your hand and call the teacher or test monitor. They will know what to do.



When you finish answering the practice questions, the program will show you the message in this picture.



The test will start automatically. Relax and get ready; the first question will come up soon. Keep answering the questions until the computer tells you that you have finished the test.

If you don't know the answer to a question, go ahead and choose what you think is the best answer.

Read Out Loud

When you have finished the test, tell the teacher or teaching assistant that you are finished so the next student can get started.

If you have any questions about this test, please ask them now. Once the test starts, the teacher or teaching assistant will not be able to tell you if you have picked the right answer.

General Testing Information

Pausing or Stopping a Test

If a student needs to leave the room unexpectedly while taking a test, you can stop a test by selecting **Stop Test** in the upper-right corner of the screen. A prompt will ask if you want to resume the test later, stop the test, or cancel the action. A student has eight days (192 hours) from the initial starting date and time of a test to resume the test at the point where they left off (the student will see a different item, however). Keep in mind that pausing or stopping a test is a nonstandard administration; use this option only when absolutely necessary. See <https://short.renaissance.com/HWXpaQ> for more information.

Practice Questions

In the first screening window for the year, students will be presented with practice questions before the actual test starts. If a student fails the practice, they will see an alert and will be given another set of practice questions to answer. The teacher and test monitor should assist the student with the new set of questions to help them pass the practice.

If the student fails the second practice, they will be logged out of the program. They should be logged in again and the teacher and test monitor should continue to assist the student until they pass the practice.

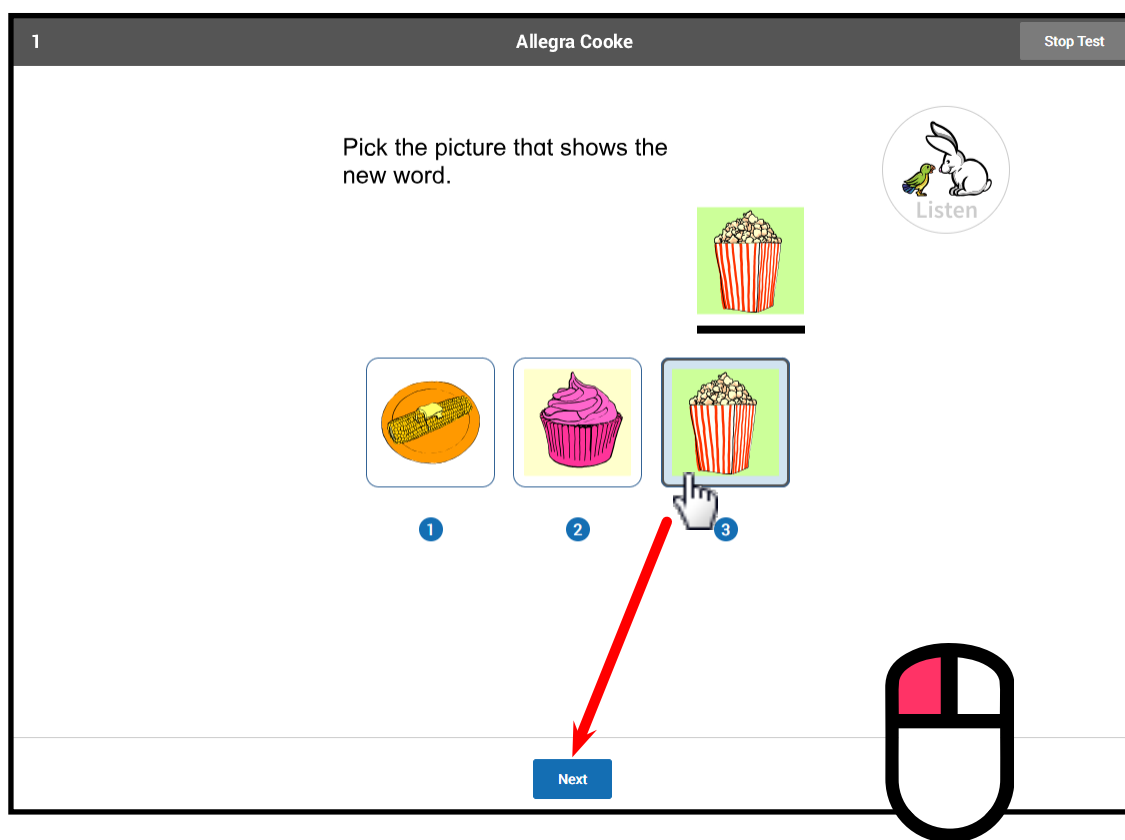

Login Page		<p>When a student accesses their school's unique Renaissance website, they will need to choose I'm a Student to log in.</p> <p>Please note: your school/network name will show at the top of this message.</p>
Invalid Username or Password		<p>When a student has entered a username or password that is not correct, they will see this message: "Unable to login. Check your username and password."</p> <p>Use the Student Password Report to verify the student is inputting the correct information.</p>

Locked Out		<p>If a student enters their password incorrectly 5 times in a row, they will receive this message: “You are locked out. 



Can't Test Again (MSIS already used)	 <p>Can't Test Again</p> <p>Reason: MSIS Number already used</p> <p>A test for this screening window has already been taken under this MSIS Number. If the test needs to be retaken, have an administrator deactivate the previous one.</p> <p>Dismiss</p>	<p>Students may only test one time per assessment per screening window through the K Readiness Assessment tile. A student will receive this message if an assessment has already been recorded in the current screening window under the MSIS assigned to the student.</p> <p>If an assessment needs to be retaken under the K Readiness Assessment tile, an administrator can reach out to the District Testing Coordinator to request a test deactivation.</p>
Can't Test Again (Already taken elsewhere)	 <p>Can't Test Again</p> <p>Reason: Already taken elsewhere</p> <p>A test for this screening window has already been taken at another district under this MSIS Number. Choose Class		<p>When starting a Star Early Literacy assessment, if the student is asked to choose a class, they should select the class name and then select Next. This happens when the student is enrolled in more than one class with the same product assigned.</p> <p>If you do not want students to choose a class, an administrator can unassign products from one of the classes on the Classes and Courses page.</p>
Date and Time Preference (Monitor Password Override)		<p>The Dates and Times for Star Assessments Preference determines the dates and times that students are allowed to take Star assessments. When the preference is on and students are trying to access Star outside the set dates and times, they will receive this message.</p> <p>With the monitor password override enabled, the monitor password can be entered to allow the test to be taken. To view what the monitor password is, see the Monitor Password Star Tests Preference.</p>
Date and Time Preference (No Monitor Password Override)		<p>If the Dates and Times for Star Assessments Preference is on with no monitor password override, students will see this message. When they click OK, they will be logged out. If you would like to allow students to test during this date or time, an administrator can edit the preference to reflect that.</p>

Question Time Out		<p>Although Star Early Literacy test scores are not based on how quickly students answer questions, there is a time limit for answering each test question. If student need more time to answer the questions, please see the Extended Question Time Limits Preference.</p>
Stop Test		<p>Situations may arise in the classroom that interrupt a test (for example, a fire drill). If this happens, the teacher or test monitor can stop the Star Early Literacy test, either temporarily stopping it so the student can return to it later or stopping it entirely so the student can start over on a new test.</p> <p>To stop or pause a test, click Stop Test in the top right corner of the screen. (If Stop Test was clicked in error, choose Cancel.) The steps below provide information about pausing or stopping the test.</p>




Connection Errors

Connection Error		Network delays can cause the program to slow down temporarily, sometimes resulting in a lost connection to the server. The program will try to re-establish a connection, but students will see this message if the program was unable to re-connect to the server. To resume the test, log out of Renaissance and then log back in again.
Oops! We hit a snag!		Students may see this message due to network or internet connectivity issues or if your Renaissance site is experiencing technical difficulties. Check the system status page to see if a site performance event has been reported. If so, students should be able to continue as normal when the issue is resolved.

Test Flow

There are a number of preference settings and conditions that may affect a student's testing experience. This section will help you navigate the process depending on the different variables.

Step 1: The teacher opens Renaissance in a web browser.

Step 2: The teacher selects **I'm a student**.

Step 3: The teacher (or student) enters the student's user name and password and selects **Log In**.

Step 4: On the Home page, the student selects the **K Readiness Assessments** tile with the **MS** in the corner, and then the **K Readiness Assessments** tile with the yellow **EL** in the corner.

Step 5: Is the student enrolled in more than one class that is using Star Early Literacy?

Yes: The student selects one of the classes they are enrolled in, then selects **Next**; go on to step 6.

No: Go on to step 6.

Step 6: DTCs/STCs: Has the Password Requirement Preference been set to require a monitor password? (See <https://short.renaissance.com/e9qrUY>.)

Yes: Ensure "KRA Star Early Literacy" is listed at the top of the screen. Verify that the correct student name is displayed on the Star Test message. The teacher enters the monitor password and selects **Start**; go on to step 7.

No: Go on to step 7.

Step 7: Is this the first screening window for the year?

Yes: The student watches a short demonstration video and answers some practice questions; go on to step 8.

No: Go on to step 8.

Step 8: The student is presented with some practice questions to answer. Did the student pass the practice?

Yes: Go on to step 9.

No: Go on to step 8a.

Step 8a: The student will get another set of practice questions to try; the teacher or test monitor should help them pass the practice. Did the student pass the second practice?

Yes: Go on to step 9.

No: The test will **not** begin; the student is automatically logged out. Log the student back in and have them try again (go back to step 2).

Step 9: The test begins, and the student answers the test questions.

Step 10: The test ends, and the student is automatically logged out.

Time Limits

There are three different time limits that can be set for students taking the Star Early Literacy test: Standard, Extended, and Unlimited.

- ▶ Standard is the base level of time.
- ▶ Extended is set using the Extended Question Time Limit Preference (see <https://short.renaissance.com/Vfz3e8>), and only affects practice questions and actual test questions. Changes to time limits should be made by **DTCs or STCs**.
- ▶ Unlimited is set using the “Allotted Time” section of the Accommodations Preference (see <https://short.renaissance.com/KAIXWE>), and only affects actual test questions. Accommodations should only be set by **DTCs or STCs**.

a. If there is no activity from the student within this amount of time, the student will be shown a dialog box. The student will have 60 seconds to close the dialog box and return to the test, effectively resetting the 900-second timer. If the student does not close the dialog box within 60 seconds, the student's current progress on the test will be saved and the text will be ended (treat as a paused test; “Pausing or Stopping a Test” on page 12).
