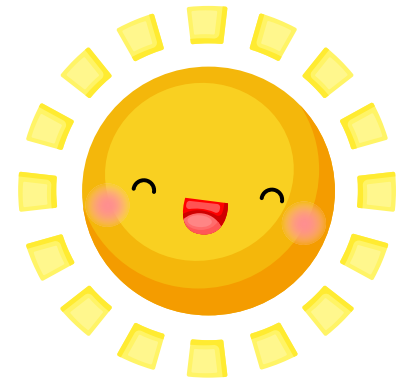

And washed the spider out.**

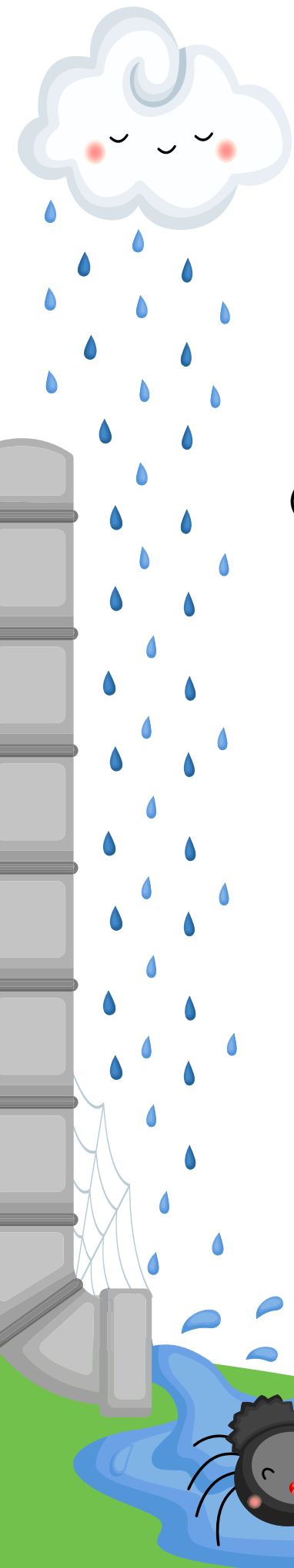

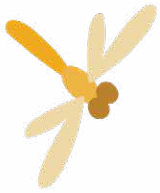
**Out came the sun

Ten Little Fingers

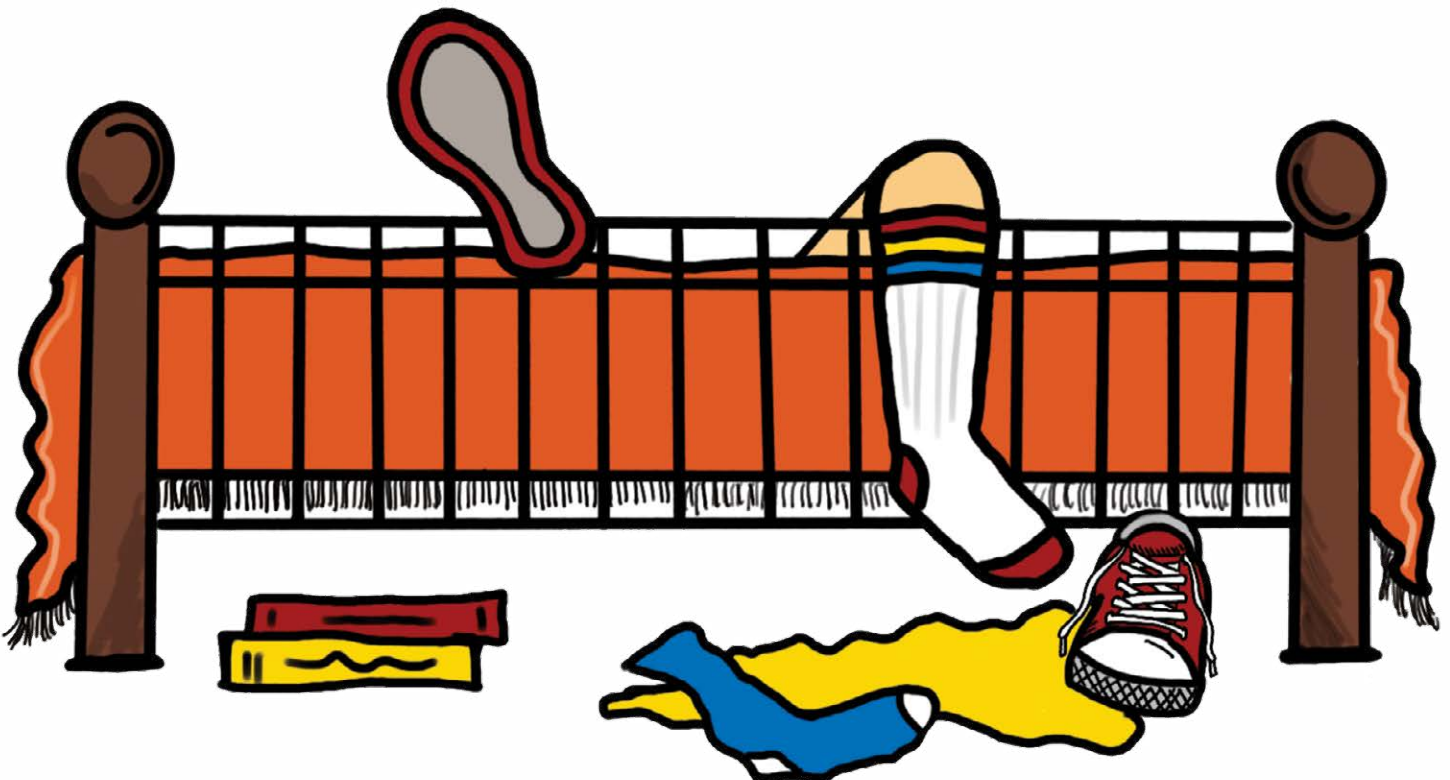
I have ten little fingers,

Stop right now.**

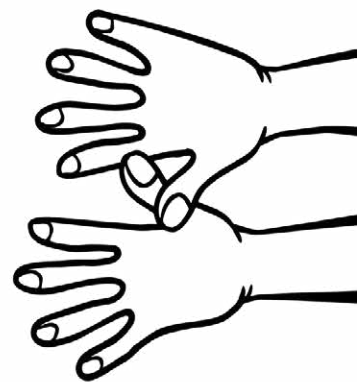

That hung in the skies.

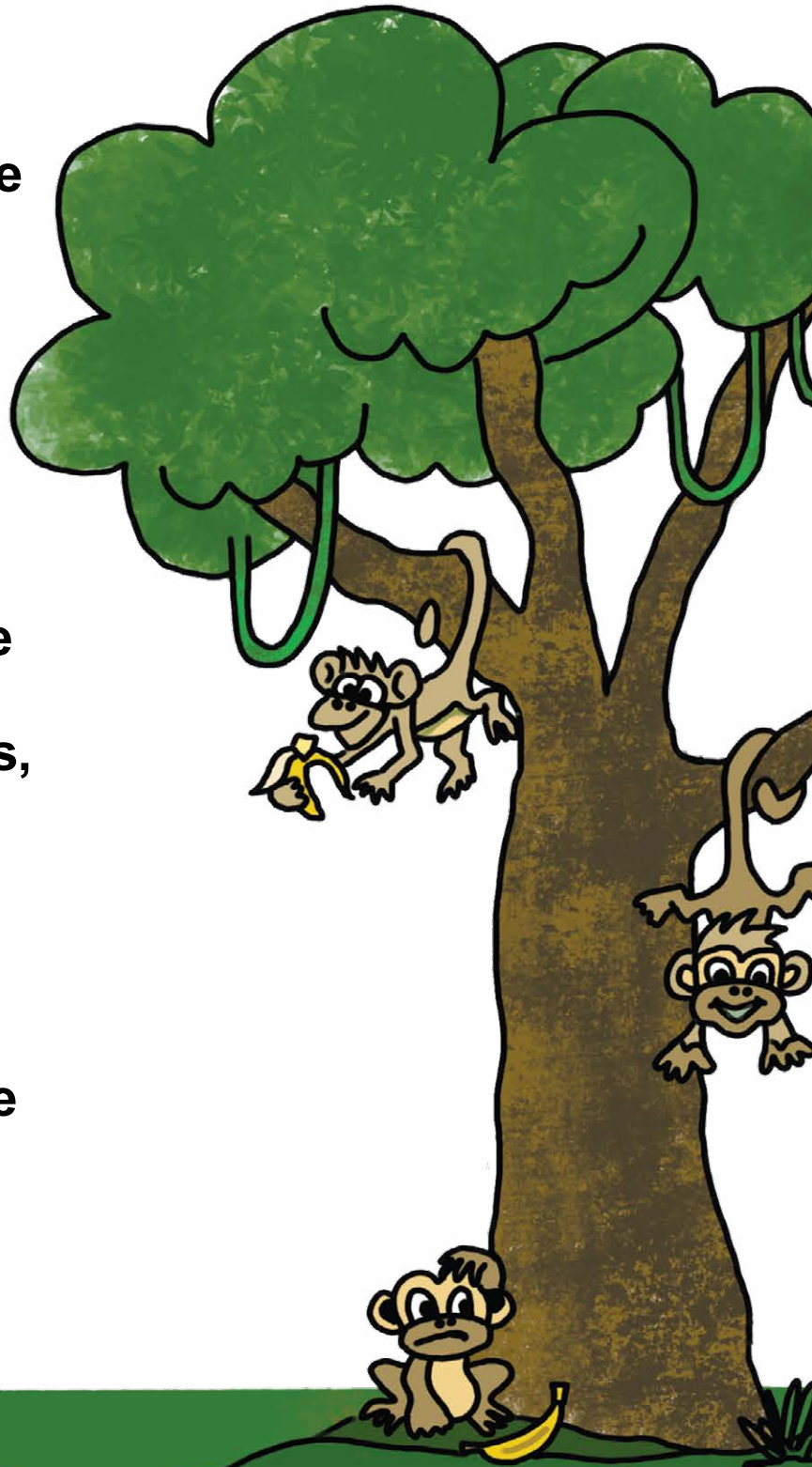

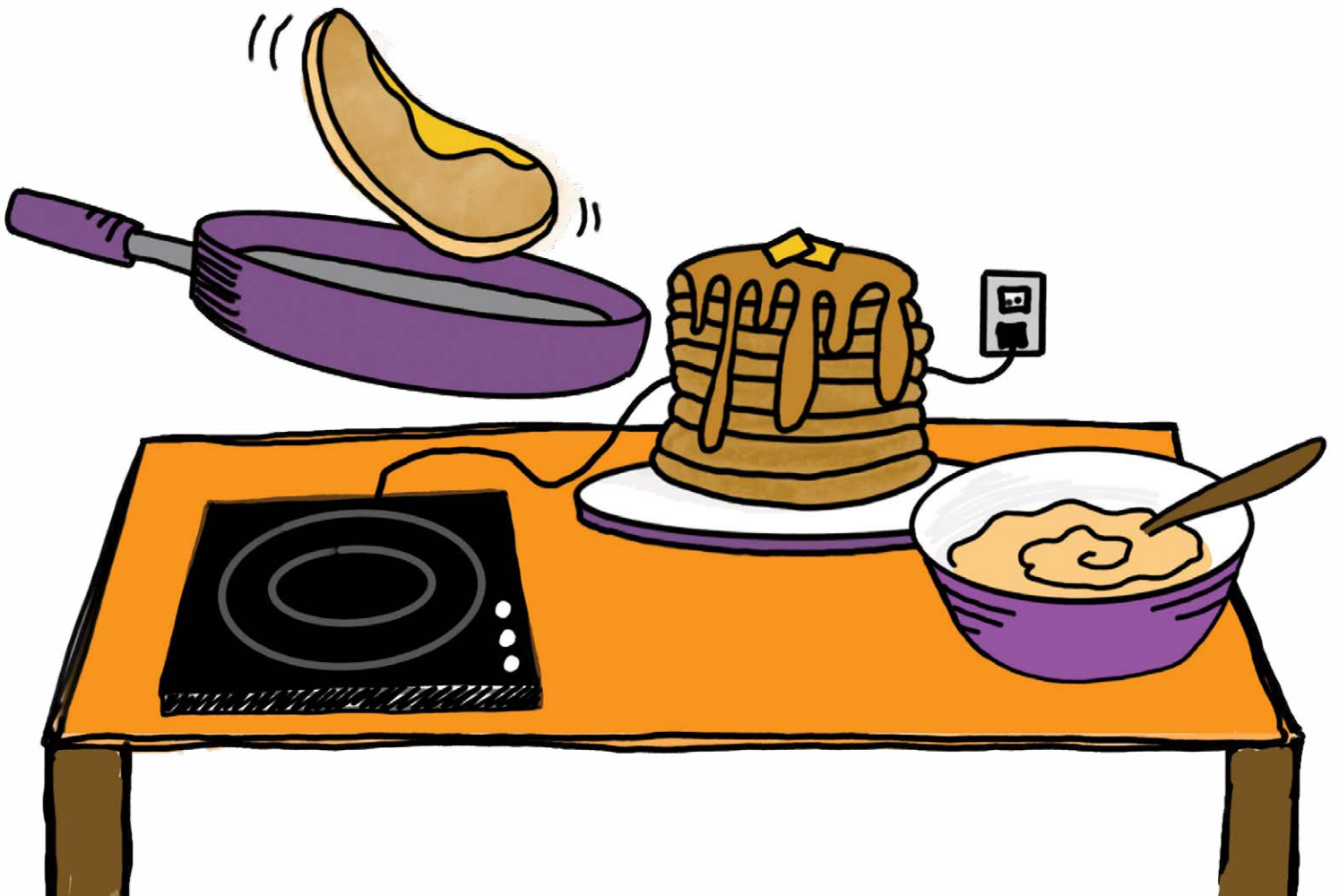

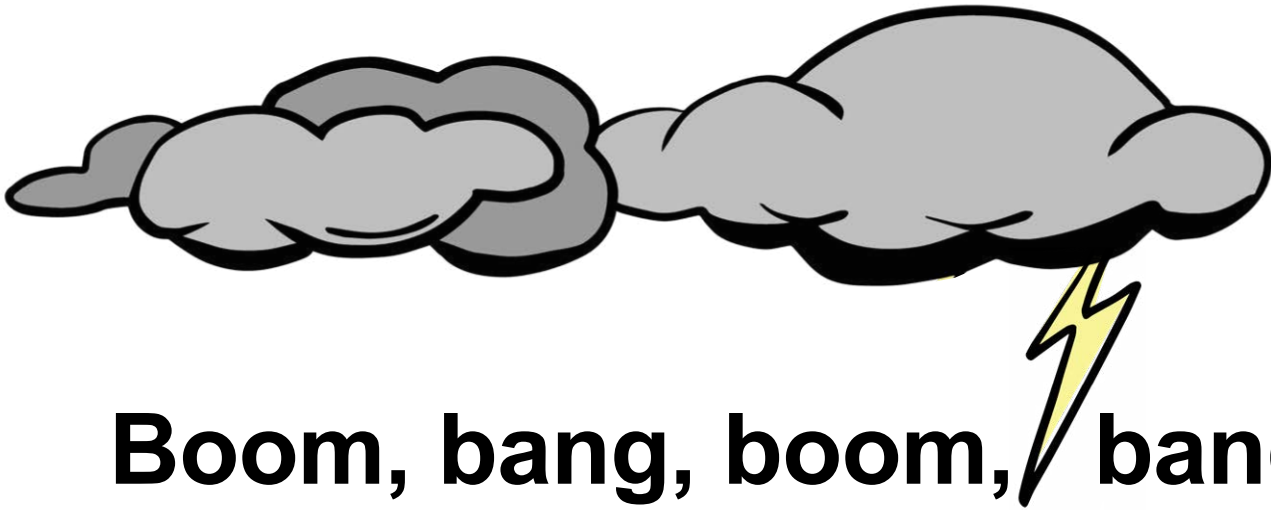
My Big Balloon

What very gently soars along?**

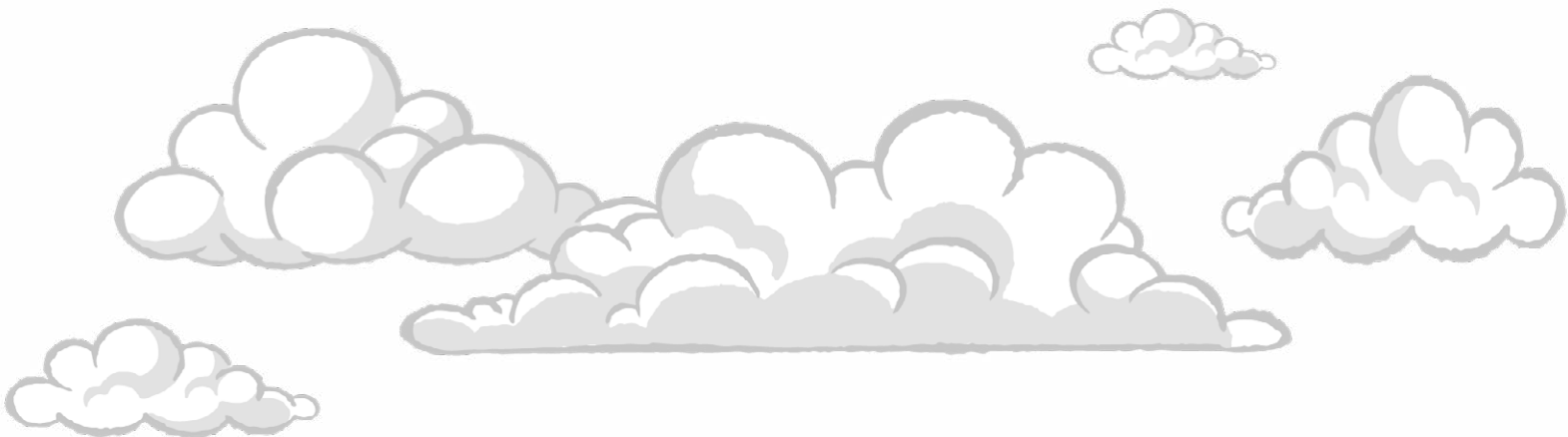
What brings the rain,

On a snowy day.

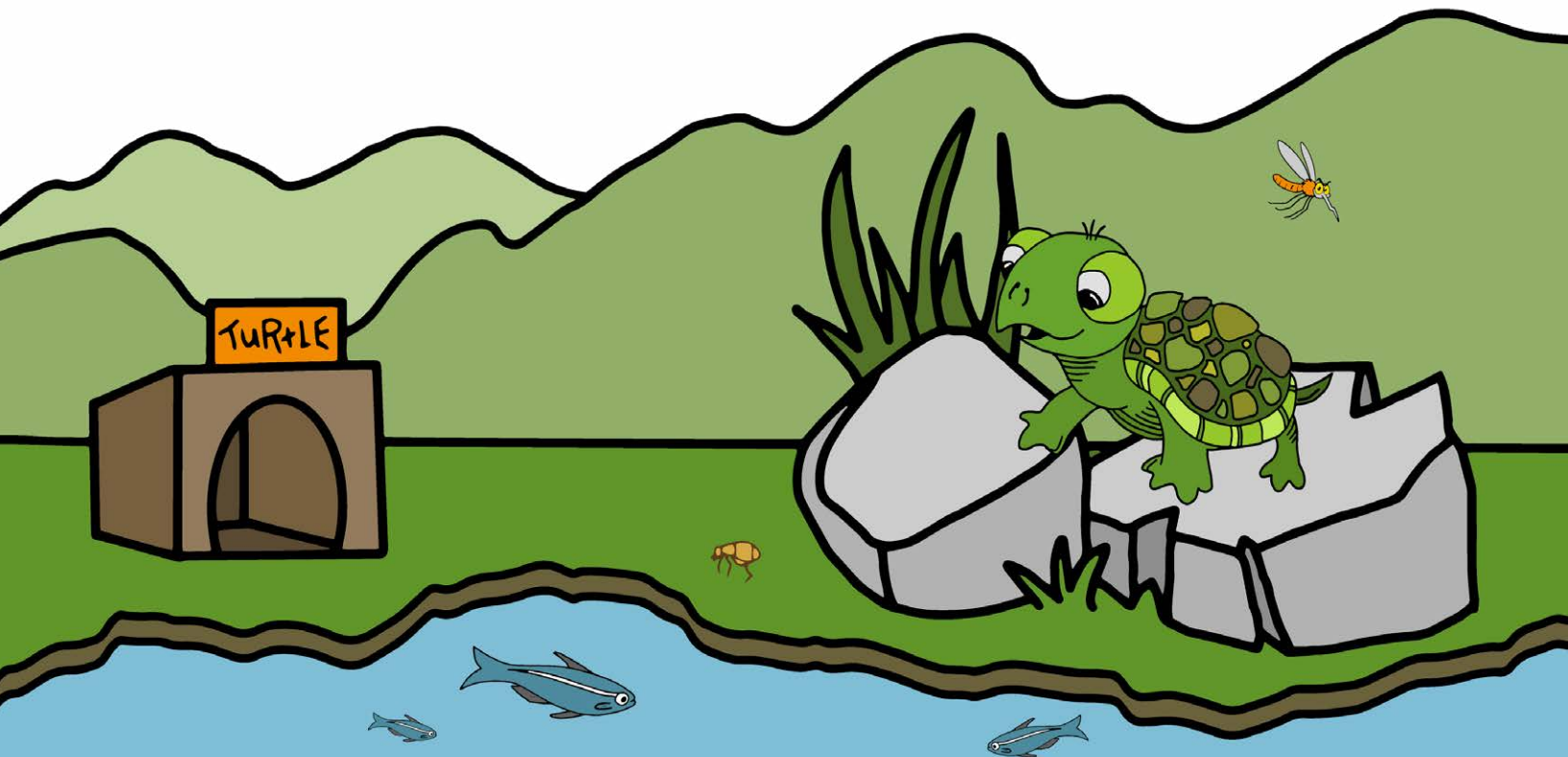


The Little Turtle

(Show three fingers, then rest head on hands)

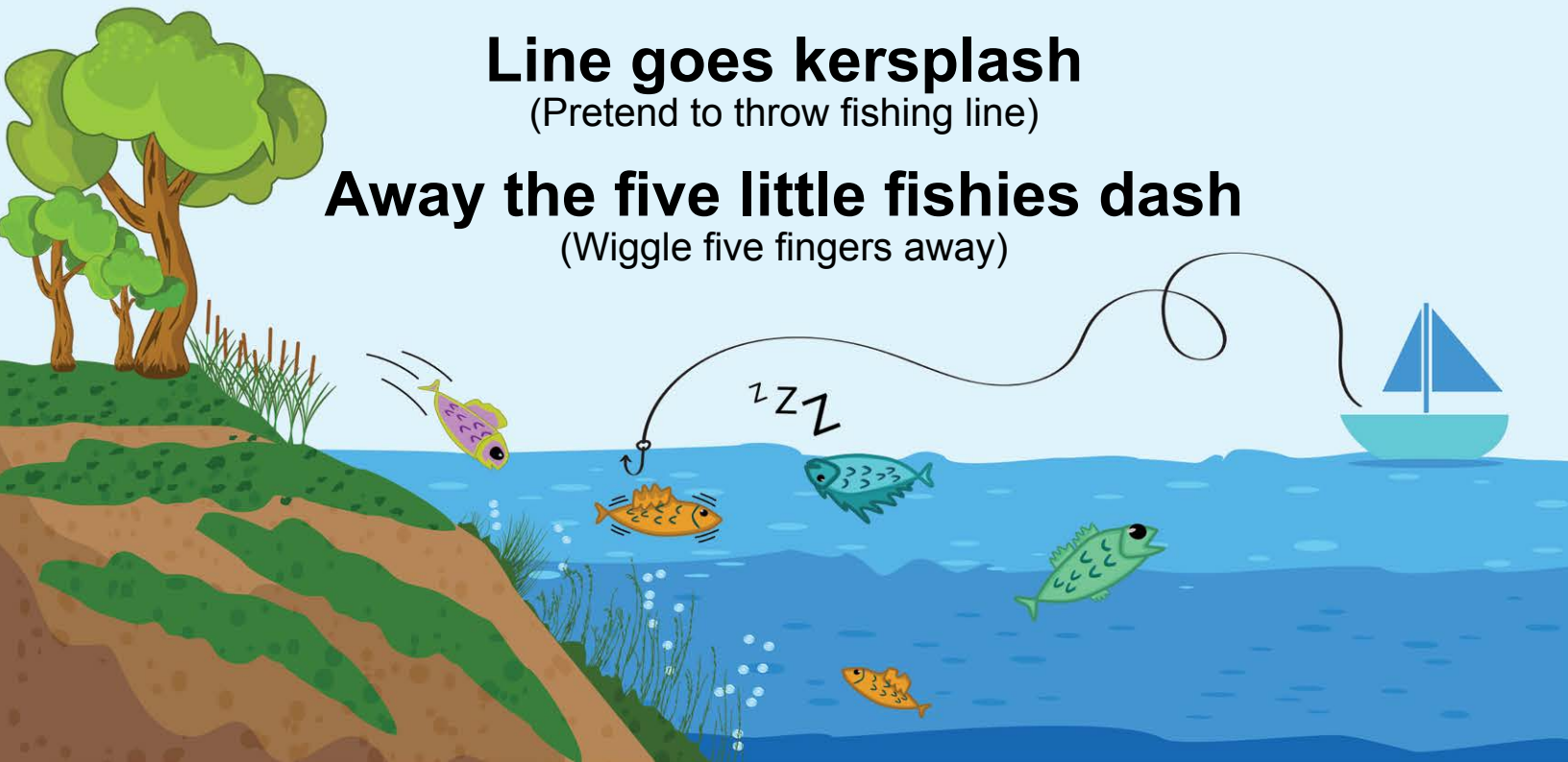
The fourth one said, “Let’s take a dip.”

(Form ‘V’ with fingers, then move hands away from body)

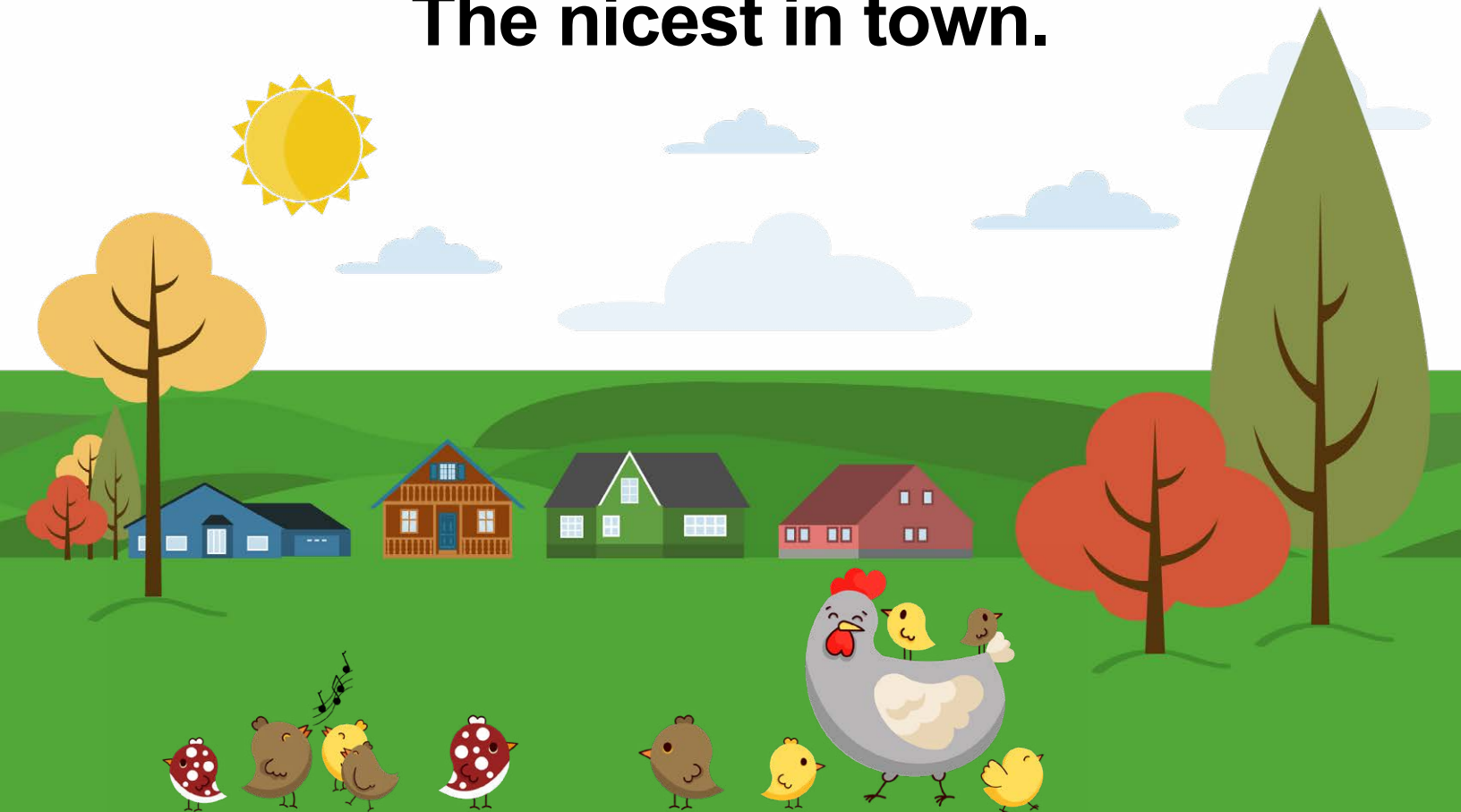
Line goes kersplash

I Measure Myself

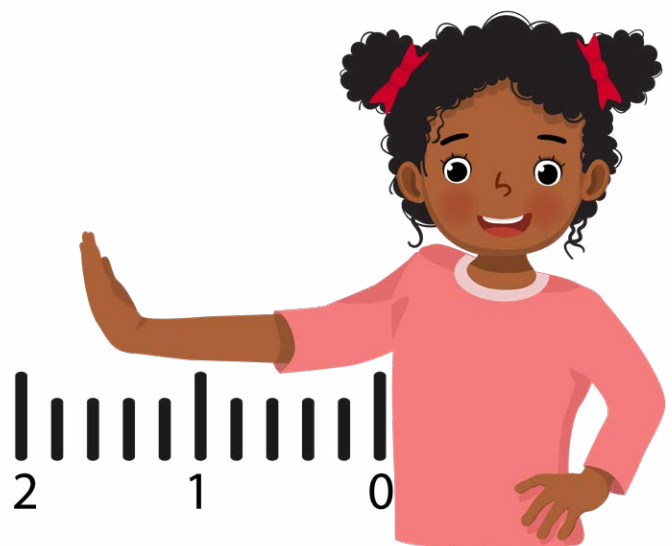


**I measure myself
