Legacy Code	MSIS Code	MSIS Description
Head Start	Head Start	This is a federally funded holistic family and child education program. Head Start sites serve three- and four-year-old children for a school term.
Child Care	Child Care	Licensed child care facilities that care for children from typically 6 weeks to 5 years old for full-time care. After the children start school, they provide after-school care. This provider offers year-round care.
Family Care	Family Child Care	Child care provided within a caregiver's home. The person caring for the child could be a caregiver or neighbor.
Home	Home-Based Informal Care	Child care provided within the child's home until they enter school.
Pre-K private	Private Pre-Kindergarten	This program would be housed in a private school.
Pre-K public	Public Pre-Kindergarten	This program would fall under the Title I pre-K, Early Learning Collaborative Pre-K, or State Invested Pre-K program in a public school for three- and four-year-old children.
	Early Head Start	This program serves infants and toddlers under the age of 3, and pregnant women. EHS programs provide intensive comprehensive child development and family support services to low-income infants and toddlers and their families, and to pregnant women and their families.
	State Preschool	This program would fall under the Early Learning Collaborative Pre-K or the State Invested Pre-K program housed in a public school, Head Start or child care center for four-year-old children.

Early Childhood	d Special Education (619)	Early Childhood Special Education (ECSE) services are designed for young children (aged 3-5) with disabilities who need specially designed instruction or related services and whose disability(ies) causes the children to be unable to participate in developmentally appropriate typical preschool activities.
Home Visiting		Early childhood home visiting is a service delivery strategy that matches expectant parents and caregivers of young children with a designated support person—typically a trained nurse, social worker, or early childhood specialist—who guides them through the early stages of raising a family.
Early Interventi	on Services Part C	Part C of IDEA provides for early intervention (EI) services for children determined eligible from birth to their third birthdays. EI services assist young children with atypical physical, cognitive, communication, adaptive and social or emotional development.
Migrant Head S	tart	A Head Start program that serves families who are engaged in agricultural labor.
